

The GT Field of Dreams is totally handicapped accessible. It has a synthetic surface that will allow easy use of wheelchairs and walkers. The registration has begun and the instructions can be found at the Township's website. There is no nominal fee, the league will utilize fundraising, and to play is FREE! Donations are welcomed to help with the costs of operating the league, the uniforms and equipment. No child will be turned away because of an inability to pay!



The Gloucester Township Field of Dreams

GT Field of Dreams is an organized baseball league for special needs children and adults which enables these children and adults to develop socialization skills and HAVE FUN by playing baseball at a field specifically designed for them. It is located at 247 Little Gloucester Road in Valleybrook. Every child and adult, no matter his or her level of baseball talent, can participate in the Gloucester Township Field of Dreams!

Each game will typically last 60 minutes. The games are non-competitive in nature, with each player batting, running the bases, and scoring each inning. Volunteers called "Buddies" will be assigned to each individual to assist throughout the game. There are no losers, only winners with the scored tied at the end of each game. Each player will have a "Buddy." The Buddy is there to protect the player from balls, assist the player in batting and running the bases and to be a friend on and off the field. Buddies start at the age of 12. The siblings, parents, relatives, and friends of the players are eligible to be Buddies. Public Works are utilizing video cameras to detect

pipe damage

The Portable Video Inspection Unit is used by Public Works employees to inspect the inside of the storm water pipes, as small as 8 inches wide! This piece of equipment lets them see if there are any issues inside a pipe without sending an employee into a possible dangerous situation. Sewer Repair crew can then determine if and what is wrong with the pipework, prioritize the severity of the damage, and schedule corrective work accordingly. The benefits of this kind of inspection are numerous: from efficient maintenance of the systems to preventing potholes and sinkholes in the street!



New Ordinance in Affect



The Gloucester Township Police Department would like to advise our residents of an amended local ordinance (L.O. 81-35) which has taken effect regarding parking vehicles in business parking lots. The four parking lots that were added to this ordinance are all located along Blackwood Clementon Rd. They are Commerce Square I and II (TD Bank Lot), Commerce Square III (Former Superfresh Lot), 1370 Blackwood Clementon Rd, and 1468 Blackwood Clementon Rd (Cherrywood Shopping Center). It is prohibited to park a vehicle over 3 tons GVW at any time in these lots (deliveries to the shopping center excluded).

It is also prohibited to park vehicles, boats, or trailers with the intent to display "For Sale" at any time. Signage has been installed at these locations which indicates that violators are subject to a fine up to \$1000.00 and towing of the vehicle at the owners expense.

This ordinance along with many others, is yet another way of decreasing crime throughout Gloucester Township and showing the criminal element that we care about our community and want to keep it clean and vibrant!

BE SMART911 ABOUT SAFETY

The Gloucester Township Police Department is encouraging our residents to sign up for the Smart 911 program.

This program was recently announced by the Camden County Freeholders and is designed to save critical time in emergency situations.



Smart911 is a free nationwide service that allows users to create a Smart911 Safety Profile which provides vital information to emergency dispatchers and first responders during an emergency situation.

Gloucester Township residents are encouraged to create their safety profile with Smart911, to have their information available to dispatchers and to receive emergency notifications. Smart911 is a private and secure system that is made available only to the 9-1-1 system in the event of an emergency call.
