The Gloucester Township Police Department would like to invite you to join our contemporary neighborhood watch program called Dog Walkers Watch. Dog Walker Watch (DWW) is a crime awareness program sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW) that encourages dog walkers nationwide to serve as “extra eyes and ears” for local law enforcement agencies. There are dozens, if not hundreds, of dog walkers throughout the community. Dog Walker Watch trains these individuals on how to effectively observe and report criminal activity to the police department.

The GTPD would like to invite you and your pet-friendly dog to attend our event for Dog Walkers Watch on June 17th, 2017 from 10:00am-12:00pm at the

Timber Creek Dog Park. Come out and learn how you can help us fight crime by reporting suspicious activity. Residents who attend will be assigned an anonymous Dog Walkers Watch Number and Card to report crime activity in their neighborhoods.
