

Premium Outlet Center Breaks Ground; Look for Opening in 2015

The largest economic development project in Township history is now underway! The Gloucester Premium Outlets at Gloucester Township, located off the College Drive interchange on Route 42, have cleared the ground with the building construction moving forward. This project will produce the largest complex in the Township in terms of size, employment, and value.

The Outlets are planned to have over 450,000 square feet of retail space, with over 80 stores and support 800 full and part time jobs. As well as creating up to 300 construction jobs. Restaurants, other eateries, and a "town square" are also part of the design.

The project is a partnership of an affiliate of Simon Property Group and PREIT-Rubin, development investment trust. This group has produced and operates 81 Outlet centers in the US and abroad, including Jackson, NJ and Limerick, PA.

Excited dignitaries held an official "groundbreaking" in August as shown. The Outlets are planned to open sometime at the end of the summer 2015.



The formerly vacant Diamond Diner has been totally renovated and converted to "Favorites", an Off-Track-Wagering establishment which has attracted many visitors and patrons to the Blackwood-Clementon Road area.

A Message from Mayor David Mayer



Typically the summer months can be a slow season but not here in Gloucester Township where we have been busy working on economic development and job creation. Over this past summer, the construction of the Gloucester Premium Outlets at Gloucester Township was started. This project is

the largest economic development initiative that we have seen in Gloucester Township, one that will create up to 300 construction jobs and 800 permanent retail jobs. The outlets will also help enhance future economic development in our community by assisting the growth of current businesses and helping to attract new businesses.

The College Drive Interchange is not the only area where we have seen new businesses open. Our Blackwood-Clementon Road corridor has seen the closed Stone Grill restaurant transformed into Favorites at Gloucester Township, a state licensed Off-Track Wagering Facility that brought with it over 45 jobs. Also, the old Taco Bell will be reopened with a new modern design.

We have also re-launched our façade improvement program along the Black Horse Pike in the downtown Blackwood section of our community and have seen positive results by the relocation of Mainstage Center for the Performing Arts into Academy Hall which is located next to the Gloucester Township Rotary Library.

Our work also continues at our new Citizens Appreciation Park, located in the Glendora section along the Black Horse Pike. A ceremony will be held in early October with the first round of names being added to the Wall of Honor, thanking so many who volunteer their time to make Gloucester Township a great place to live. Our newly constructed multi-purpose field will open this Fall at Community Park and construction will be completed shortly on the expansion of our recreation center.

As we prepare for Autumn, we will continue to work hard at improving the quality of life of all our residents. I wish you the very best and thank you for helping to make Gloucester Township a great place to live, work and play.

BRUSH PICKUP

As per Township Ordinance, branches, hedge trimmings, light brush clippings, etc. must be securely tied into **three foot (3') bundles** that can be easily handled and the diameter of any branch may not exceed six inches (6"). The bundles shall not exceed **fifty (50) pounds** in weight. Public Works will pick up bundles on your designated day only if the ordinance is followed.

We are not a tree service. During storm damage, we will work with residents to pick up their brush, however the ordinance must be followed. No commercial vehicles can dump at Public Works. For questions on brush pick-up please call Public Works at 856-228-3144.

Bagged Grass Clippings and Bagged Leaves



11/1-3/15 - GTPW collects bagged grass and bagged leaves WEEKLY on your recycling day with the exception of Friday which will be picked up on Thursday. GTPW will not accept plastic trash bags. Please note: grass clippings generated by a commercial land-scaper will not be collected.

GTPW collects leaves according to the fall leaf schedule. A second pick up will start after the first round is complete, weather permitting. Residents are reminded to rake their leaves curbside, NOT IN THE STREET, only during the fall leaf schedule which ends 12/31. After this time all leaves must be bagged.

Halloween Safety:

Trick or Treating participation in Gloucester Township has been growing. The Gloucester Township Police want to remind everyone to think of safety first:

Walk Safely

- Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks.
- Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- Put electronic devices down and keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
- Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.

Trick or Treat With an Adult

- Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, they should stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.
- Drive Extra Safely on Halloween
- Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs.
- Enter and exit driveways and alleys slowly and carefully.
- Eliminate any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.
- Drive slowly, anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic and turn your headlights on earlier in the day to spot children from greater distances.

GTPD Project SAVE (Substance Abuse Victimization Effort)

The illicit use of prescription drugs has created an epidemic throughout the United States. The Gloucester Township Police Department understands that heroin addiction is no longer a problem facing cities and is now in the backyard of suburban communities like Gloucester Township. The Gloucester Township Police Department has developed initiatives and an action plan which focuses police efforts and practices in three critical areas of law enforcement SUP-PRESSION, PREVENTION, and INTERVENTION in an effort to effectively combat this epidemic both now and in the future.

One of the most significant initiatives associated with Project SAVE is the SAVE Advocate which entails having a New Jersey Certified Drug and Alcohol Counselor in this Municipal Court Room.

When those suffering from such addiction are arrested for these crimes they often appear in Municipal Court where there are seldom available resources for dealing with those suffering from addiction.

The absence of such a drug court program in municipal court often leaves defendants, family members of those suffering from addiction, and even the Judge with few options regarding treatment or assistance. The Project SAVE Advocate will be present in the Gloucester Township Municipal Court to assist defendants suffering from addiction, their family members, the Municipal Prosecutor, and the Judge with providing information about available treatment programs.

The SAVE Advocate will also serve as a resource for the Gloucester Township Police Department in providing information about treatment programs to individuals who need assistance and information regarding substance abuse for themselves, a friend, or a loved one.

GTPD Earns Speed Enforcement Laser For National Law Enforcement Challenge



The Gloucester Township Police Traffic Safety Unit was the recipient of a Laser Technology Incorporated TruCam handheld speed enforcement laser. The laser was awarded as part of the 2014 webinar training series for the National Law

Enforcement Challenge. The challenge is a national traffic safety awards program that recognizes excellent law enforcement traffic safety programs.

The Gloucester Township Police Department was awarded first place for our departmental category the past two years. The department also won an LTI laser in 2012 for our traffic safety efforts.

The new speed enforcement lasers are being used to enforce speed violations on roadways within the Township where excessive speeding has been identified.

SCHOOL EMERGENCY TERMINOLOGY

LOCKOUT: which is used to secure exterior of the school in the event there is danger nearby all while allowing school staff to continue teaching their curriculum.

SHELTER IN PLACE: where the exterior and interior doors are all secured and no movement is allowed in hallways

LOCKDOWN: would be used during a violent criminal act, natural emergency or other concern for the safety of students and staff.

Always remember to keep an eye out for suspicious activity around schools and school bus stops. Please report any suspicious activity immediately to the Gloucester Township Police Department at 228-4500 or 9-1-1 for an emergency. Do not confront anyone and never put yourself in danger

Traveling To School Safety Tips

The beginning of September is a busy time for Gloucester Township residents as school starts. The Gloucester Township Police wants everyone to remember to be safe while traveling to and from school. Please read the following safety tips:



Traveling To and From School

- Map out with your children a safe way for them to walk to school or to the bus stop. Avoid busy roads and intersections. Do a trial run with them to point out places they should avoid along the way, such as vacant lots, construction areas, and parks where there aren't many people.
- Teach children to follow traffic signals and rules when walking or biking. Stress that they should cross the street at crosswalks or intersections with crossing guards when they can.
- Encourage children to walk to school or the bus stop with a sibling or friend,
- and to wait at bus stops with other children.
- Teach children not to talk to strangers, go anywhere with them, or accept gifts from them without your permission. Tell them that if they see a suspicious stranger hanging around or in their school they should tell an adult.
- Help children memorize their phone number and full address, including area code and zip code. Write down other important phone numbers such as your work and cell phone on a card for your children to carry with them.

On the Bus

- Have your children arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to pick them up.
- Make sure children know to stand on the sidewalk or on the grass while waiting for the bus.
- Teach children to make sure they can see the bus driver and the bus driver can see them before crossing in front of the bus. Tell them to never walk behind the bus.
- Be aware that often bullying takes place on the school bus. Ask children about their bus who they sit with, who they talk to, and what the other kids do. Let them know that if they see someone being bullied, or are bullied themselves, they can talk to you, the bus driver, or another trusted adult.
