Mr. Mercado opened the public portion.

Mrs. Sargentoni asked for an explanation of Resolution 307. Mr. Mercado stated that this could be a loan or a grant and used for open space acquisitions. Mr. Cardis stated that it is not designated for any project at this time and no application was filed. Mr. Hutchison stated that if this resolution is not adopted, it would lock us out of the opportunity to apply.

Mrs. Carr stated that she also read this resolution, and the resolution stated that this could be a matching grant. She questioned if it was a matching share, then we would have to come up with some of the money. Mr. Mercado stated that we are not committed to any dollar amount. Mr. Mercado stated that this is for an open application, with no particular project. She asked where the money would come to match such a grant. She also asked if the township was using all of their open space monies. Mr. Cardis stated that we are using much of it.

Ms. Grace of Hampshire Road asked about the grant and if it could be allocated to different locations. Mr. Cardis stated that no, it has to go for acquisition of land.

Ryan Bains of Laurel Hills asked how many surveillance cameras would be going into the parks. Mr. Cardis stated that he believes it is three locations. Chief Earle stated that these will help when the parks are not being patrolled by the police department.

Ray Polidoro of Erial also spoke about the same resolution. He stated that council would be passing an open ended resolution. He asked if this will come before the public again. Mr. Cardis explained the process of applying for a grant and stated that an application would have to be made to Green Acres. Mr. Polidoro spoke more about the grant process and if there was a time factor on this resolution. Mr. Mercado stated that he thought that there was some type of timeline. He also asked about the surveillance cameras. Mr. Hutchison stated that we are protecting our investments at the parks in the township.

Mrs. Stubbs stated that safety is an issue in the parks.

**PUBLIC PORTION:**

Mr. Mercado opened the public portion.

Carolyn Grace of Hampshire Road stated that she has moved back to the Gloucester Township and the Brittany Woods community and wants to make a difference. She stated that her first love is social work and she wants to put her background to use in her neighborhood. She stated that she spoke to the Council in August, and that she has met with Officer McLaughlin to attain this goal. Ms. Grace stated that she has started a community action group which has done a talk and walk through the neighborhood. She commended Officer McLaughlin and stated that with her help they were able to put up a few light posts in the neighborhood. She also stated that her group has looked at the many vacant homes there are in the development. Ms. Grace stated that they have designated a Block Captain for each street in the development and she has activities planned for the future. She asked how Council will help them to make this a good project. Mr. Mercado stated that unfortunately, the neighborhood has a lot of absentee landlords. He stated that this is a wonderful step that the homeowners have taken and he would like to come out and tour the neighborhood with the committee. Ms. Grace stated that they would like to have an

organized play area for the children in the community. She stated that if neighbors see that the township is supportive, then this will help the community.

Mr. Baines of Laurel Hills wanted to further discuss open space and the use of the monies. Mr. Cardis stated that the monies would be for acquisition only. Mr. Baines asked if the township is able to generate money from these properties. Mr. Cardis stated that if the township makes money, then they would have to give it back to the state. He also asked about an exchange area for Craig's List at the municipal building.

Shirley Johnson, a resident of the township since 1980, stated that she has spoken to everyone she could concerning Brittany Woods. She stated that she has cleaned her development. She also stated that on her street there are 26 children with nothing to do. She stated that the officers do come out to her development. Ms. Johnson stated that she feels Brittany Woods is overlooked and she has spoken to Lt. Barton concerning these problems. She spoke about the tire park that was taken to erect the Timber Creek High School. She said that there is no place for the children to play, other than in the street.

Joanne Carr of Timberbirch suggested that the Township use this as a project on Martin Luther King Day. She stated that this Sunday is the Open House at the Tavern from 1-3. Mainstage will be entertaining at the Christmas Open House.

Dorsett Kelly of Sicklerville stated that Council is working their way through the outdoor music problem adjacent to her development. She stated that the groups are now playing indoors and she feels that this is now turning into a nightclub. She stated that the area is zoned Neighborhood Commercial and who would she address this to? Mr. Mercado stated that it is zoned as a restaurant and banquet facility.

Sam Sweet of Erial stated that the streaming of the council meetings goes in and out. He asked if there was any chance of getting the meetings televised or upgrading the internet. Mr. Mercado asked that the internet get upgraded.

Ms. Johnson questioned why there are no sidewalks in Brittany Woods. Mr. Mercado stated that this development was built in the 1970's and the sidewalks were waived at that time. She asked again that the township find the children of the development, a playground as there is no place for the children to play. Ms. Grace also asked about the culture in Brittany Woods and about trash pickup.

Mr. Ray Polidoro of Erial spoke about the tire park in Erial. He stated that there were also swings in that park. He suggested the township contact Loews to pay for a playground in the area.

Joanne Carr of Timberbirch commented on the televising of the meetings and how her father would enjoy watching the meetings on television as he does not use the computer.

Matthew Wilson confirmed the remaining funds that are in the open space fund. Mr. Cardis stated that this money will pay for the cameras

Mr. Sweet of Erial asked why Brittany Woods does not have the pink recycling cans. Mr. Cardis stated that the streets are too narrow and there is parking on both sides. He asked if the cans can be put in a designated area. He stated that the council should look into some type of playground.

There being no further comment, the public portion was closed.
