

The Visionary Leader Award honors leaders whose extraodinary work is positively impacting communities. "When I got the letter from the NAACP I was very honored. And my immediate thought was about the individual who was very active in this organization and someone that I was very fortunate to meet and to learn from - Mr Paul Harris. Mr Harris understood how important it was to bring the community together and not tear the community apart, to apply the fundamental right of equality. I strongly believe that Mr. Harris was a visionary leader and I am extremely proud to be the recipient of this award," said Mayor Mayer. On the question of how we can develop more visionary leaders today, Mayor Mayer said: "First you have to set an example. An example of good leadership of doing your best to make right decisions that are not just based on your own beliefs but also have an open mind to include interests of others. You also have to inspire people to get engaged in their community; and, as leaders, we do have responsibility to approach people and get them engaged so that they can also make a difference in their community. It's really about setting the example of good leadership and it's also about the inspiring people to get engaged as well."
