Improving Quality of Life in Gloucester Township

There's been a lot going on in the Township construction-wise: from architectural upgrades of the 3 commercial plazas on Blackwood Clementon Road to building a 55,000 square foot green Gloucester Data Center on Glen Drive. And yet there's more coming soon!

Mayor and Council are excited about the successful grand opening of the Gloucester Township Field of Dreams this past April. The Field of Dreams is an organized league for special needs children and adults designed to enhance development of socialization skills and encourage them to go out and have fun playing ball! The field is equipped with synthetic surface to allow easy use of wheelchairs and walkers. It is located at 247 Little Gloucester Road in Valleybrook and is open to every child and adult no matter their baseball skill level!



A new Gloucester Township Heritage Park on Somerdale Road is currently being built by the Department of Public Works. The historic park will feature plaques with significant chronological events of the Township enabling citizens to trace the history of

Gloucester Township from its incorporation in 1695 to modern days. To make the experience truly unique and interactive the park will offer QR (Quick Response) codes which will allow smart phone users to get to know the Township in an engaging new way. The anticipated completion date of the new Gloucester Township Heritage Park is the end of May.

Additionally, the old Owens Corning Fiberglass property along Somerdale Road has become one of the largest solar projects in Gloucester Township. Hundreds of solar panels generating a total of 3MW of solar energy have been installed on the "capped" landfill. This project not only generates revenue for the Township, but also adds ecological benefits due to the production of clean energy, and environmental controls at the site, such as protection of the "cap", slope stability and constant maintenance and monitoring of the property.

The installation of a new bike-share kiosk is underway with 10 bicycles soon being available at West Church Street and Railroad Avenue (across from Caboose) dusk till dawn, 365 days a year. The station location was selected based on proximity to community infrastructure resources such as park trail, parking, and easy accessibility and will feature a Bluetooth lock module kiosk. Residents will sign-up with the administrator via Rider App and will be given a code to unlock a bicycle, which will be free of charge. The completion date is scheduled to be mid-May - right in time for Gloucester Township residents to enjoy warm weather and our beautiful Township bicycle path which will be further extended this year!

There's a lot happening in Gloucester Township from reshaping the infrastructure to encourage biking and walking to appreciating historic moments of our area and enjoying a "greener" community. To add to the above, the Township also approved a budget that does not include any new municipal tax increases this year. We truly live in a thriving community that continually strives to make an impact and improve the quality of life of our residents!

SOLUTIONS TO STORMWATER POLLUTION

In accordance with our NJDEP Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit, the Twp. adopted various Ordinances to regulate the impact of stormwater runoff and pollutants on the environment.

1. Pet Waste: This requires pet owners to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property. It prevents fecal contamination from impacting the local waterways.

2. Litter: This states it is unlawful to throw, drop, discard or otherwise place litter of any nature upon any public or private property, other than in a litter receptacle. This prevents unsightly & unsanitary conditions & prevent litter from impacting waterways.

3. Improper Disposal of Waste: This states that it is illegal to dispose of waste in any place not specifically designate for the purpose of solid waste storage or disposal. The purpose is to prevent unsanitary conditions and groundwater pollution.

4. Wildlife Feeding: Feeding of water fowl on municipal park property is prohibited by Ordinance. The Township enacted the Ordinance as a method to reduce water fowl population in response to health concerns regarding bacteria which is harmful to humans and fish populations.

5. Yard Waste: Yard waste is regulated by Ordinance which establishes the current zone collection system and the methods of collecting leaves, brush, and other yard waste. The purpose is to keep leaves and grass out of the storm sewer system.

6. Illicit Connections: This makes it unlawful to connect any pipe or device to the municipal storm sewer system that is intended to discard, spill or dump any material other than stormwater runoff or ground water (sump pumps) into the system. The purpose of this Ordinance is to prevent pollution and contamination of waterways which receive discharge from our storm sewers.

The transport of pollutants into local water bodies destroys fish, wildlife and habitats; threatens public health and causes the loss of recreational and aesthetic value. We have enacted these Ordinances to protect our environment, and to keep pollutants that are commonly conveyed by stormwater from adversely impacting our waterways and groundwater supplies.



Please keep grass clippings out of the street and our waterways. It is against DEP state and local regulations. The grass clippings clog our storm waterways and put toxic chemicals into our waterways.

GTPD Remote Monitoring Station

In October 2016, The Gloucester Township Police Department (GTPD) introduced our new Remote Monitoring Station and mobile camera trailers. The GTPD's Remote Monitoring Station is a new program that has real-time video feeds from many of its community parks and Township properties that has already helped solve cases.

The GTPD continues to use every technology advantage to help improve safety in the Township. With Gloucester Township experiencing a low in serious crimes, the GTPD looks for more ways to keep the Township even safer. The Remote Monitoring Station was designed to promote greater community and officer safety. When issues occur in monitored areas, an examination of camera recordings in the moments before and after can reveal vital clues or suspects, or provide valuable information to responding police officers.

From the Memorial Day weekend through the Labor Day holiday, we enjoy all types of warm-weather events, but summer is also a critical time for injuries. In fact, more mishaps occur during these 101 days than they do the rest of the entire year.

BUCKLING UP FOR SAFETY

• Now that your vehicle is inspected, you're almost ready to go, but not before everyone is buckled up. Make sure everyone is buckled up before leaving the parking lot or driveway.

• Remember that young children must be properly secured in a child seat. Buckling up is the only way to give everyone a chance to survive in the event of a collision.

SUMMERTIME DRIVING TIPS

• Plan the route from your home to your vacation carefully before you leave. This will help avoid confusion out on the road.

• Keep in mind that warm weather tends to shorten attention spans and tolerance of other drivers. Maintain your composure and keep in mind that getting angry at another driver only makes it harder to think clearly and to drive safely.

• During summer travel, you will be driving in heavy traffic. Expect sudden stops, abrupt lane changes and distracted drivers.

• You will need to use all of your defensive driving skills to stay safe; do not allow yourself to be distracted by items in your car or by a cell phone.

• Always maintain a safe following distance and drive at a speed safe for the conditions and traffic level.

• Be cautious at all intersections; don't run through yellow lights and be sure all traffic is actually going to stop before pulling out on a green light.

• Finally, remember that you must never drive while being under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
