

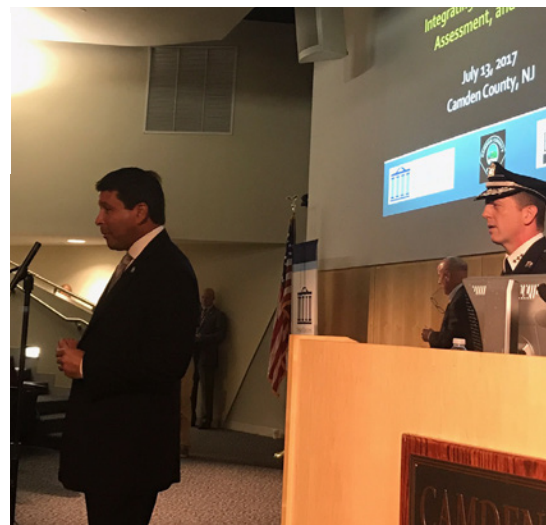

Mayor Mayer and Chief Earle attended the ICAT event

Thursday, June 13, Mayor David Mayer and Gloucester Township Police Chief Harry Earle spoke at the ICAT event held at the Camden County College earlier today. Presented by the Police Executive Research Forum (PERF), ICAT stands for Integrating Communications, Assessment, and Tactics training and is a new way of thinking about use-of-force training for American police officers. It is anchored by a Critical Decision-Making Model that helps officers assess situations, make safe and effective decisions, and document and learn from their actions. By providing police officers with more tools, skills, and options for handling different types of critical incidents, ICAT focuses on enhancing both officer safety and public safety. As an independent research organization, PERF strives to advance professionalism in policing and to improve the delivery of police services through the exercise of strong national leadership; public debate of police and criminal justice issues; and research and policy development. Among other honorable speakers, Attorney General of New Jersey Christopher Porrino, William Fitzpatrick, Acting U.S. Attorney, District of New Jersey, as well as Commissioner (ret.) Charles H. Ramsey from Philadelphia Police Department also spoke of the importance of the ICAT training.

Coming Soon: Two Brand New Playgrounds for Children



Mayor Mayer and Council are delighted to announce that residents will soon be able to enjoy two brand new playgrounds in Brittany Woods and Blackwood Estates developments.

UPDATE: Gloucester Township Bike Share Program



The installation of a new bike-share kiosk is underway with 10 bicycles soon being available at West Church Street and Railroad Avenue (across from Caboose) dawn till dusk, 365 days a year. The station location was selected based on proximity to community infrastructure resources such as park trail, parking, and easy accessibility and will feature a Bluetooth lock module kiosk. Residents will sign-up with the administrator via an app and will be given a code to unlock a bicycle, which will be free of charge. The kiosk is anticipated to be completed by August, 2017.

In the meantime, the residents are encouraged to check out the Bike Sharing App.
