On Wednesday, August 30th the ribbon was cut for the new Inspira Urgent Care and Imaging Center at the Marketplace on Chews Landing Road.

Inspira Health Network is a charitable nonprofit health care organization serving communities across southern New Jersey. The network, which traces its roots to 1899, comprises three hospitals, a comprehensive cancer center, several multi-specialty health centers and a total of more than 125 access points.
