GT Fire Districts Purchase New Air Packs with FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant

On Tuesday, February 20th, Mayor David Mayer joined Congressman Norcross at a press conference for the FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) that was awarded to Gloucester Township Fire Districts 2, 4, 5 and 6, along with Pine Hill Fire District #1 and the Lindenwold Fire District.

The FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Program is a federally funded program designed to provide financial assistance to fire departments to enhance their ability to protect their communities.

The grant authorized the purchase of brand new, state-of-the-art equipment. This equipment will be placed in service in the near future, and will greatly enhance the safety of our firefighters while also improving their ability to protect the residents of Gloucester Township!





In the Fall of 2015, the Chews Landing Fire Department recognized the need to replace their 35 air packs and 70 air cylinders, as they were nearing the end of their ten-year warranty coverage and were starting to require frequent and costly repairs. The air packs were also missing some vital firefighter safety equipment available on newer air packs. An air pack is one of the most vital pieces of equipment used by a firefighter and the department knew that

they had to address the need, which led them to file a regional AFG application in January of 2016 on behalf of GT Fire Districts 2, 4, 5, and 6, along with Pine Hill Fire District #1.

Unfortunately, the departments were notified that they did not receive the grant in August 2016. Undaunted, the departments again applied for the grant in early August 2017, adding the Lindenwold and Deptford Fire Departments. On September 22, 2017, they received the notification that they had been awarded the grant. The grant authorized the purchase of 204 air packs, 408 cylinders and 352 air masks.

Gloucester Township Joins Camden County Lawsuit Against Opioid Makers



Mayor David Mayer joined Freeholder Louis Cappelli at a press conference announcing a pioneering lawsuit against several drug manufacturers and distributors Wednesday, February 21st. Camden County is seeking to recover millions of dollars the local government has spent combating the opioid crisis over the last decade.

The suit is the first of its kind to attack pharmaceutical companies for their role in the deadly epidemic. The 181-page complaint, filed in Camden County Superior Court, contends that drugmakers methodically targeted doctors, the public, and regulatory

agencies with false marketing capaigns aimed at convincing Americans that opioids are not addictive. Meanwhile, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that 75 percent of patients in heroin treatment first became addicted to prescribed opioids. Officials say this "epic scheme" spurred the crisis that Camden County now faces.

A Message from the Mayor and Chief

Dear Community Members,

In light of the recent tragic killing of students and staff members in Florida, we believe it is most appropriate to provide some information to you. As you may be aware, the Gloucester Township Police Department has a comprehensive School Resource Officer Program consisting of armed and professionally trained police officers.

It is important to understand that we believe that preventing an active shooter requires much more than an armed officer in a school. Such prevention requires a strategic combination of School Resource Officers (SRO), school security measures, formalized sharing of critical information between schools and their local police, community wide action planning for youth in need of services, appropriate screening of the possession of firearms by those experiencing mental illness, and community members and students informing their school or law enforcement of any suspicious activity or alarming statements by anyone. One of the most important functions of our SRO's is their role in being part of a larger community wide support system for students and families.

Of course, we know that such terrible violence can happen anywhere, and it is so important that all community members, including children know they should and can report anything that causes them alarm or seems odd. Anyone may report suspicious activity to the Gloucester Township Police Department by calling 911 (Emergency) 856-228-4500 (Non-Emergency), or our GTPD Anonymous Crime Tip Line: 856-842-5560. 
