Mayor David Mayer, Chief Harry Earle, and students and staff from Black Horse Pike Regional School District sat down with Congressman Donald Norcross on Wednesday, February 28th for a roundtable discussion about gun safety and the impact of the Florida school shooting that happened earlier this month.

The topics of debate covered the issues of arming teachers, gun control laws and the recent tragic event in Parkland.

The Congressman stated "Simply offering thoughts and prayers after each tragic mass shooting – then doing nothing – means nothing and Americans know it. We need to have open conversations about gun violence in our communities and resolve to take action."

"A lot of this is born on local government. There are some people in Washington that want to spend billions on building the Wall; maybe they should spend that money on the children of this country and on our schools, " noted Mayor Mayer.
