Local Business Spotlight

Learn more about our Local Business Spotlight of the week: Cotardo's! This weekend downtown Blackwood will come alive with entertainers, vendors, shoppers, and families during the Blackwood Pumpkin Festival. This tradition began in 1992, which means that this year marks its 27th year. Over the years, hundreds of thousands of visitors have attended.

The festival, presented by Mainstage Center for the Arts (MCA), takes place this Sunday, October 7th from 11:00 am - 4:00 pm in and around the area of MCA's Performing Arts Academy, 27 S. Black Horse Pike. The Black Horse Pike will be closed from the intersection of Church Road through Lake Avenue.

Since parking around the festival fills up quickly, free parking and a shuttle bus service to the festival is available at Highland Regional High School.

The festival will feature amusements, food, music, shopping, live entertainment, pumpkin painting, hayrides, moon bounces, a petting zoo, face painting, scarecrow building, costume contests, a puppy parade, a talent contest, a Mainstage studio treasure hunt, and more.

"As Mainstage celebrates its 30th anniversary this year, we're thrilled that the South Jersey community has been able to enjoy the Blackwood Pumpkin Festival for 27 of those years. It's such a fun way for friends and families to spend a day celebrating the joys of the fall season," said Anne Marie Weaver, Director of Special Projects, MCA. "We appreciate all those who visit the event, which raises funds for Mainstage's year-round performing arts programs for kids and their families." Only registered vehicle participants may pass candy out to our Trick-or-Treaters, however, the event itself is open to everyone (not just registered vehicles).

How It Works:

Each car must be registered online. Registrants will receive a confirmation with instructions prior to the event. Only registered cars will be displayed in the Park and an adult

must be with the vehicle at all times during the event. All cars participating in the event must be in the lot prior to 6:30 PM. Volunteers will be there to assist you. There will be a prize for the Best Decorated Trunk. You can decorate your own vehicle or collaborate with another family to decorate your vehicle. Be creative, but not too scary as you decorate your trunk for trick-or-treaters.

"Trunk or Treat" starts at 7:00 PM within Veteran's Park. Children of Registered Cars will get to enter the course first.

No plastic bags or metal, including binders, bound books and binder clips. Paper clips/staples are OK. *Must be a Gloucester Township resident*.

It is almost that time of year again! Public Works will begin Leaf Collection on November 5, 2018. Look for signs on the road. Don't Worry! If you miss your round, we will continue to collect until all leaves are picked up.

To make this program a success, please adhere to the following:

- Try to keep all leaves unbagged at curbside. If you must use bags, please use paper bags only.
- Have all leaves curbside the weekend prior to your week. Do not rake leaves into the street if it will block traffic.
- Do not mix trash and broken branches with leaves. This clogs the machines and your leaves will not be picked up.
- Do not park any vehicles in front of leaves during your pick up week. They will not be picked up.
