SATURDAY DROP-OFF HOURS AT PUBLIC WORKS

The Public Works facility will be open on Saturdays through November 17th from 8:00 am - 2:00 pm for residential recycling drop-off. This will be for brush, oil, white goods, electronics, metals, concrete, propane tanks, and car batteries. They DO NOT accept paint or trash.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION BEGINS MONDAY!

Public Works will begin Leaf Collection on Monday, November 5th. Look for signs on the road. Don't Worry! If you miss your round, they will continue to collect until all leaves are picked up. To make this program a success, please adhere to the following:

•Try to keep all leaves unbagged at curbside. If you must use bags, please use paper bags only. •Have all leaves curbside the weekend prior to your week. Do not rake leaves into the street if it will block traffic.

•Do not mix trash and broken branches with leaves. This clogs the machines and your leaves will not be picked up.

•Do not park any vehicles in front of leaves during your pick up week. They will not be picked up.
