GTPD Puts GPS Tracker on Packages to Deter Thieves

As the holiday season and Cyber Monday approach, Gloucester Township Police perform a demonstration of the GPS tracking system that is being implanted in select packages in Gloucester Township.

Twelve months ago, the Gloucester Township Police Department started this new crime-fighting initiative to combat package and bicycle theft. Packages and bikes implanted with a GPS tracking system and left on doorsteps and at convenience stores around town have resulted in a total of 7 arrests so far.

"If you're not an honest, law-abiding citizen, then don't come to Gloucester Township because you never know if the item that you are stealing is equipped with a GPS tracking system," said Mayor David R. Mayer.

"Today we are announcing a strategic approach to theft that entails an emphasis clearly on arrest, but also involves our other strategic focus on prevention and intervention as well," said Chief Harry Earle. *(continued on page 2)*





"I want to be clear that this initiative was not implemented due to a rise in crime as crime has been reduced dramatically since 2010. With that in mind, our actions have been undertaken to help continue this decline."

Gloucester Township Police wishes you a happy start to the holiday season. Consider these tips to help combat package theft:

• Have place you can have your packages delivered. For example, if you work during the day, have items you order online delivered to your place of business instead of your home address. Instruct family and friends to do the same for packages they mail to you throughout the year.

• Keep your car and house doors locked at all times.

• Be neighborly. If you see a package sitting on a neighbor's doorstep, reach out and ask if they would like you to hold it until they are home.

• If possible, require a signature for all your deliveries. If there's no one home to sign for the package, it won't be left at your home.

• If you are having your purchases shipped to your house, sign up for delivery alerts from the shipper. If you aren't home during delivery, message a neighbor to have them take the package back to their place until you get home.

• Discourage thieves from targeting your residence with a few strategic home security devices. Home surveillance cameras can be effective crime deterrents. Your home security cameras should be prominently displayed where potential criminals can see them, yet high enough to prevent them from being tampered with. Outdoor security lighting and a home alarm system can also be effective crime deterrents.

• Keep an eye out for suspicious vehicles and subjects in your neighborhood. Putting a stop to package theft and residential burglaries is a team effort. Talk to your neighbors and encourage everyone to keep an eye out for suspicious activity (an individual or vehicle following a delivery truck, a stranger removing a package from outside a residence, etc). 
