PUBLIC WORKS IS WINTER-STORM READY





As the snow season approaches, Public Works is hard at work preparing their equipment to be able to handle any storm as quickly and efficiently as possible!

Gloucester Township has 14 brine trucks that are able to brine the entire township in just 14 hours or less. It is standard to brine up to three days prior to a storm; however, the township tries to brine as close to a predicted storm as possible. On average, it takes 11,000 gallons to brine the entire town and, as of today, Public Works has over 10,300 gallons of brine on hand with more constantly being made so that we are ready when the first snowfall hits. Brine will only clear .75 inches of snow. If the expected snowfall is 2 inches or more then they will also salt the streets. In addition to brine, we have 800 tons of salt ready to go.

Gloucester Township also has 47 trucks ready to plow snow when needed. Plowing typically starts once 3 inches of snow have accumulated. The township has 211 miles of road to maintain with trucks going out into all sections of town. Our Public Works Department always does its best to get the job done on their own; but sometimes, during a major storm, contractors are called in to assist township personnel with snow removal. When this happens, over 200 pieces of equipment hit the streets of our township. Although each snow storm is different and there is no real way to predict the severity of one, Public Works is always prepared for the worst. You can help by removing cars, trash cans, and basketball nets from streets prior to a storm to ensure that the snow removal process goes smoothly.










It's Not Too Late To Sign Up For GTPD Citizens Police Academy
