MLK DAY OF SERVICE RESCHEDULED



Thompson, 12, and Donato, 10, both are residents of Gloucester Township. To Kill A Mockingbird runs February 8th & 9th at 7:00 pm and February 10th at 2:00 pm at Dennis Flyer Theater at Camden County College. Tickets are \$18 for adults and \$15 for senior citizens/students 18 and under.
