

## Local Business Spotlight

Check out a new business in town: Mystic Ginger! Gloucester Township is joining The American Heart Association and municipalities across the country in America Goes Red For Women, a campaign designed to raise awareness for heart disease and stroke. Heart disease is often thought of as a "man's disease," however, many people fail to realize that heart disease is also the leading cause of death in women in the United States. Beginning on Friday, February 1st, National Wear Red Day, and continuing for the duration of the month, the Gloucester Township Municipal Building and Gloucester Township Public Works buildings will be illuminated red to support this cause.

For the past decade, the state of New Jersey has ranked amongst the top states in the country for having the most illuminated buildings supporting National Wear Red Day. Last year, New Jersey had roughly 85 landmarks, buildings and properties illuminated red. Gloucester Township is thrilled to be a part of this national awareness month once again and spread the word about the importance of heart health.





On Tuesday, February 5th, Gloucester Township took part in celebrating Safer Internet Day. From cyberbullying to social networking, each year Safer Internet Day aims to raise awareness about emerging online issues. The campaign's slogan, "Together for a better internet," is a call to action for all stakeholders to join together and play their part in creating a better internet for everyone, especially younger users.

Here in Gloucester Township, our LEAD (Law Enforcement Against Drugs) Officers teach students throughout the community Internet safety as part of the Student Improvement Program (SIP); however, it is proven to be more effective when these conversations are continued at home.
