



GTPD RANKED #7 IN THE COUNTRY FOR NNO

Congratulations to the Gloucester Township Police Department for ranking #7 in the country for National Night Out (NNO) 2018, America's annual night to stand up to crime. We are thrilled to announce that we advanced one rank from the previous year. This means that Gloucester Township had the seventh largest National Night Out celebration in all of the United States!

National Night Out was first introduced by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW) in August of 1984 and has only continued to grow year after year. Neighborhoods across the nation host block parties, festivals, parades, cookouts and various other community events with safety demonstrations, seminars, youth events, visits from emergency personnel, exhibits and much more. Today, 38 million neighbors in 16 thousand communities across the nation take part in this national night out against crime—a night for community members to get out of their homes and be reacquainted with one another while meeting our police officers.

Thank you to everyone who came out and participated in Gloucester Township's annual National Night Out this past summer. The GTPD couldn't have received this great honor without all of you!






GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP CELEBRATES
