POTHOLE SEASON IS UPON US!

An important part of road maintenance is the repair of potholes. Potholes are created when moisture seeps into the pavement, freezing, expanding, and then thawing occurs. This weakens the pavement. Traffic loosens the pavement even more, and it eventually crumbles and pops out. Due to the recent severe weather the Township has experienced a high number of potholes that have been reported. If you would like to report a pothole, you can do one of three things:

Please note that Public Works only repairs Township roads. The County is responsible for County roads and the State is responsible for State roads and highways. GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP WELCOMES TWO NEW FIREFIGHTERS: LINDELL AND BROGAN




