
The downtown Blackwood Section of Gloucester Township is full of life through the recently established Arts District. Last year, the township hosted the first ever Food and Craft Beer Festival to kick-start the revitalization of downtown Blackwood. The township is planning to host various arts-related events throughout the year with the Arts Market being the first this year.

This family-friendly event will feature local art, crafts, and creative works from over 30 vendors, food trucks, and live entertainment. The Arts Market is open to the public and free to attend. We hope to see you there to support the local arts community!









In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation which designated May 15th as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. In recognition and support of National Peace Officers Memorial Day, all Gloucester Township Police Officers were mourning bands on Wednesday to honor the 163 officers killed in the line of duty in 2018 as well as all law enforcement officers who have lost their lives.

#### A Message From Chief Harry Earle:

"As we move through the year 2019, the loss of police officers continues with 42 officers killed in the line of duty so far this year; however, despite such tragedy, there is hope as the number of officers killed so far this year is the lowest in decades for this time period. There has been a consistent national training campaign amongst law enforcement to spare families the tragedy of losing their beloved law enforcement family member. This initiative is known as Below100. This campaign has been launched here at Gloucester Township Police where our increased focus on training helps protect officers from those that wish to kill them and help protect officers from the tragic accidents that often take their lives. If you visit the Gloucester Premium Outlets you will see that GTPD has a new training facility at this location which has been donated by the Premium Outlets. Additionally, in the coming weeks you will likely see on patrol our 'Supervisor Patrol Support Vehicles' which carry advanced tactical and safety equipment for patrol officers, and our own training unit has been greatly expanded to meet the training demands of the Below100 initiative. The practice of keeping the community safe requires a partnership – a partnership that includes the support of the community in our overall mission which includes the most contemporary training methods that we are employing at GTPD."



# COMBATING PACKAGE THEFT IN GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP

The rise of online shopping has made everything from grocery to holiday shopping easier and more convenient. However, it has also made it easier for thieves, increasing package theft or "porch pirating" as it is increasingly known.


Use the following five tips to keep your packages safe and delivered to the rightful owners:

- 1. Install Security Cameras
- 2. Require Signature, Sign Up for Tracking Alerts, or Click-and-Collect
- 3. Coordinate With Your Neighbors
- 4. Request a Mail Hold When You're Out of Town
- 5. Have Packages Delivered to Your Workplace

The Gloucester Township Police Department wants potential thieves to know that packages delivered to homes in Gloucester Township may be equipped with a GPS device. It is also clear that they have expanded their use of this equipment to bicycles, handbags, and recently purchased merchandise so that those looking to steal are warned that bicycles and other personal belongings left unattended may likely contain a GPS tracking device.


