Turn Around, Don't Drown!

A Message From the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management

A Flash Flood Watch means that there is the potential for flash flooding which can be *life-threatening*. Flash flooding happens when heavy rain is expected to occur over a short period of time. Rapidly rising flood waters may quickly inundate roadways. Streams and creeks could leave their banks, flooding nearby properties.

Please monitor the forecast, especially if you live in a location that is prone to flooding. Be prepared to take action if a flash flood warning is issued for your area.

Here are a few tips to stay safe:

- If your area is prone to flooding, take precautions such as moving cars to higher ground.
- Turn Around, Don't Drown! Even six inches of fast moving floodwater can knock you off your feet, and a depth of two feet will float your car! Never try to walk, bike or drive through flooded areas. Water may be deeper than you think!
- Do not attempt to drive over a flooded road. Obey traffic barriers. STOP!
 Turn around and go another way.
- Keep children from playing in floodwaters or near culverts and storm drains.
