Gloucester Township Celebrates 325 Years



June 2020 marks the 325th anniversary since Gloucester Township's incorporation in 1695. Gloucester Township has big plans to celebrate its anniversary with various exciting events that will continue throughout the year to celebrate the past, present, and future of our town. The township along with members of our community's service organizations are currently coordi-

nating activities to celebrate this commemorative event.

To kick off the anniversary festivities, we will be hosting an anniversary parade in early May as a way to commemorate our town's rich history and we'd like you to join us! Local groups, organizations and businesses are encouraged to participate in the parade and enter their own unique floats. The parade is scheduled for Saturday, May 2nd with a rain date of May 9th. Stay tuned for more information.

The second event will be a time capsule burial which will take place on Saturday, June 13th at the historic Gabreil Daveis Tavern. Items of significance to the township will be buried at the tavern to be dug up by future generations. The purpose of the time capsule is to allow Gloucester Township's heritage to live on for many years to come.

Last but not least, to honor our six fire companies which are a significant part of our town's history, Gloucester Township will attempt to break the Guinness World Record for the longest Bucket Brigade. Bucket brigades were a method used in firefighting before hand-pumped fire engines in which firefighters would pass buckets to each other to extinguish a blaze. In order to break the world record and appear in the Guinness Book of Records, we need YOUR help! We are looking for 6,500 volunteers to line up and pass a bucket on Saturday, September 12th. More details and information regarding registration is coming soon.

GTPD's Family Resource Center Children's Garden expands with Monarch Butterfly Garden

The monarch butterfly is a milkweed butterfly in the family Nymphalidae. Its wings feature an easily recognizable black, orange, and white pattern, with a wingspan of



8.9–10.2 cm. The Kiwanis Club of Gloucester Township has been sponsoring a Children's Garden at the Family Resource Center for the last three years. As that has prospered and expanded, they have embarked on a new and related project at the FRC, the Kiwanis/Gloucester Township Monarch Butterfly Garden. The North American monarch butterfly population has shrunk by more than 90 percent in the past two decades. Monarch Butterflies mainly feast on milkweed and our goal of the garden is to provide a sufficient habitat and milkweed for local monarchs to thrive.

The Monarch Garden is located across the parking lot, adjacent to the field. Plants have recently been installed and the shed is being converted into a Monarch Learning Center. As part of this initiative, they involved the township more directly and the Mayor has agreed to take the Mayor's Monarch Pledge at the National Wildlife Federation. Mayor Mayer has agreed to eight of 23 points laid out by the National Wildlife Federation. With this, the Monarch Butterfly Garden will be listed on a National Website that includes other habitats throughout the country. As of August 26, 2019, we have been listed on the map as site 512. The Gloucester Township Police Department in a continuing effort to foster a better policecommunity partnership would like to invite any Gloucester Township resident 16 years of age or older to attend the Citizen's Police Academy. The Gloucester Township Police Department Citizen's Police Academy will be



a free, 10-week course that will take place starting January 23, 2020. The classes will be on Thursday evenings from 6:30 PM to approximately 8:30 PM. The course will include an overview of the police department and the administration, police communications, special operations, criminal investigations, traffic safety, K9, Special Response Team, Crime Scene Unit and much more. Also, all attendees of the Citizen Police Academy will be trained in the use of CPR for the home. Detectives Taking on Role as Teachers to Educate our Students

During the 2017/2018 school year and the 2018/2019 school year, the Gloucester Township Police Juvenile and Family Services Bureau has been working in conjunction with the Black Horse Pike Regional School District to educate our students on the dangers of sexting as well as an overview of our State's domestic violence laws to include tips for having a healthy relationship. We are targeting the incoming freshman students during a class they have called Freshman Seminar where they are taught life skills. As of this year, every student that has been enrolled in the three high schools the past two years have been taught these two very important topics by highly trained detectives from the Juvenile and Family Services Bureau.

Our Sexting presentation is taught by our Juvenile detectives who have investigated several cases involving sexting and cyber bullying. They are also members of the State's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force. They touch on the dangers of sexting and how it could negatively affect the students lives to include depression, cyber bullying and possibly acts of school violence. They explain how images produced by the students and distributed could be shared among other students and possibly end up on the internet where they could remain forever.

Our Healthy Relationships presentation is taught by our Domestic Violence Detectives. These detectives are two of the more highly trained detectives in the State concerning domestic violence and are responsible for our successful Home Involved Violence Intervention Strategies program (HI-VIS). The detectives explain the complicated domestic violence laws throughout our state and how it could affect our students. They also discuss resources for students having difficulties in a relationship.

Although these topics are very important for the students, they are also life lessons that can be followed forever. Our detectives have since started to introduce the sexting program to our 7th grade students as we have been finding that the issue is affecting kids in middle school more frequently. We also occasionally host a parent's night with our school districts where we present the same topics to our parents so they can help re-enforce these valuable lessons in the home. GTPD Launches the Fast Incident Reporting Station (F.I.R.St)



In October of 2019, the Gloucester Township Police Department has introduced the Fast Incident Reporting Station (F.I.R.St), which is our new Kiosk located in the police department in the lower level near the municipal court. You can report a variety of incidents, such as non-emergency situations, register an alarm, send in a vacation property check request, register a security camera, request a firearms permit, or even let us know you're going on vacation. Once the report has been completed, an automated email message will be sent to you advising you that the report has been submitted. If you have an issue reporting your incident or the incident you wish to report does not match one of the incident types listed, you are encouraged to speak with our Watch Desk officer, who will be able to further assist you.

The Kiosk is a great resource for the Gloucester Township community and allows citizens to have access to this system 24 hours a day as well as speed up your visit to report a non-emergency incident. The use of this system will allow for our officers to be more available for proactive police work and other high priority needs as well as calls for service. The Gloucester Township Police Department looks forward to accepting your online reports and wants you to know that this service is not intended to discourage you from requesting a response to your home or business to file a report, as well as reports can still be made in person with our watch desk officer at police headquarters.

HELP US DURING SNOW & ICE Park cars in driveway or off the street

Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the streets and highways, and an emergency exists, no vehicle shall be parked on the streets or highways or portions thereof indicated. The above parking prohibitions shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any police officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.

BRUSH PICKUP

Per Twp. Ordinance, branches, hedge trimmings, brush clippings, etc. must be securely tied into **four foot bundles** that can be easily handled and the diameter of any branch may not exceed six inches. The bundles shall not exceed **forty pounds**. Public Works will pick up bundles on your designated day only if the ordinance is followed.

During storm damage, we will work with residents to pick up their brush, however the ordinance must be followed. No commercial vehicles can dump at Public Works. For questions please call Public Works at 856-228-3144.

Please remember leaves only, do not mix debris, brush, soil, etc. After April 9, all leaves must be in paper bags and placed by your curb. They will be picked up weekly on your recycling day. GTMUA FAQ

What does the GTMUA do? The Gloucester Township Municipal Utilities Authority's (GTMUA) primary function is to maintain and service the Gloucester Twp. Sewer System. The system consists of 51 pumping stations with 13 miles of sanitary sewer force mains, 368 miles of sanitary gravity sewer mains and 4,851 manholes. We maintain over 300 miles of pipe that transport 8.7 million gallons of sewage per day from GTMUA to Camden County MUA's regional treatment plant.

What to do in the event of a sewer blockage? Contact GTMUA at 856-227-8666. We are available 7 days a week, 7:30am-11:30pm. The GTMUA is responsible for the sewer lines from the curb line to the street. The homeowner is responsible from the curb line to the house, including the cleanout at the curb. We will advise you if it is necessary to hire a plumber. Do not put the following in the toilet: Baby and flushable wipes, Feminine sanitary products and Fats, Oil & Grease.

What are the due dates? The bill is mailed out in December. It includes quarterly stubs with due dates of Jan. 15, April 15, July 15 and Oct. 15. Sign-up for email reminders at www.gtmua.com.

How can I pay my bill? We accept cash, checks, and money orders at the office. Mail payment & stub: P.O. Box 216, Glendora, NJ 08029. Our website, www.gtmua.com, to pay by checking account or credit card. There is a fee. Fees are paid directly to the company processing the payments. Contact your bank for online payments. In person: 401 W. Landing Road, Blackwood, NJ 08012. Office hours are Mon. – Fri., 8:30am – 4:30pm.

How to change the name or mailing address on your account? Please contact us at 856-227-8666 or by e-mail customerservice@gtmua.com.

Can I put my tenant's name on the bill? No. The GTMUA sewer bill is lienable against your property. If your tenant does not make payments, the property will go to Tax Sale.

Why do I have two bills? The GTMUA is responsible for the collection system in Gloucester Township, including the pipes in the street in front of your house and 51 pumping stations. We collect the wastewater and deliver it to the CCMUA Interceptor. SINGLE-STREAM RECYCLING GUIDELINES 2020

"RECYCLING COACH" APP COMES TO GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP

The "Recycling Coach" App allows residents to enter their address and receive information about what is recyclable and pick-up dates. Download the free app at the apple store or google play.

HOW TO RECYCLE

Recycling carts are collected every other week at curb side. Use your cart space wisely. Compress and flatten recyclables to maximize cart space. Cardboard must be broken down and placed vertically in cart so that the cart will empty properly. All recyclable material must fit in cart with the lid closed in order to be picked up. **NO PLASTICS BAGS.** All containers should be empty and rinsed and all recyclables must be kept as dry as possible. If you received a recycling cart, it must be used. Additional recycling material left outside recycling cart will be collected by a different truck. Any oversized cardboard that cannot be broken down (remove bubble wrap, plastic bags & Styrofoam), call The GTMUA for a scheduled pick-up.

WHAT TO RECYCLE

Only recycling items listed below go into the recycling cart/container or the material will not be collected.

Glass: containers that were previously used for food or beverages. These containers may be clear, brown or green glass.

Metal: refers to aluminum, tin or bi-metal food and beverage containers.

Plastic: that only display the plastic class types #1 & #2 recycling triangle. These containers could have been used for food, juice, milk, soda and water; no loose lids.

Paper: newspaper and inserts, catalogs, chipboard (beer & soda cartons), cereal boxes, computer paper, envelopes, gift boxes, greeting cards, junk mail, magazines, office paper, paper toilet/towel rolls, phone books, text books (without hard covers) and work books. Also, all types of flattened- folded in half/cut down corrugated cardboard (put in cart vertically so cart will completely empty).

WHAT NOT TO PUT IN THE RECYCLING CART/BUCKET

No grass, leaves, brush, batteries, electronics, construction debris, diapers, pizza boxes, Styrofoam, vinyl, food, pet waste, liquids or trash of any kind. NO PLASTICS BAGS: DO NOT put plastic bags in your recycling cart/bucket. DO NOT BAG RECY-CLABLES. Plastic bags are the worst contaminant in the recycling stream. Return plastic bags to retailers or dispose of with your household trash.

These items are to be thrown out with your household trash:

Glass: auto glass, ceramics, drinking glasses, window glass, mirrors and light bulbs.

Metal: aerosol cans, coat hangers, paint cans, pots, pans or scrap metals.

Plastic: anti-freeze or auto oil containers, bubble wrap, children's toys, flower pots, laundry baskets/buckets, lids, microwave food trays, plastic bags, plastic plates or utensils.

Paper: foil or wax coated cardboard (ice cream containers and frozen juice cartons, frozen dinner boxes), hard cover books, napkins, paper cups, pizza boxes, plates, shredded paper, tissues, towels and wrapping paper.

RECYCLING CONTAINERS

RECYCLING CONTAINERS: Multi-family properties that need an additional 96-gallon recycling cart should call the GTMUA @ 856-227-5665. Carts are only available through the GTMUA. All carts are the property of Gloucester Township and must be left at your house if you move. Recycling carts used for any other purpose other than recycling will be confiscated. Please, do not put any markings on your cart as it is Township property; each cart has an identification number and a RFID tag which will correspond with your address.

SINGLE-STREAM RECYCLING GUIDELINES 2020

GRASS CLIPPINGS will be collected as follows: March 15 - October 31: GTMUA collects grass clippings WEEKLY on the same day as your regular recycling day. Example: Your recycling day is every other Monday – your clippings will be picked up every Monday. Grass clippings can be placed into your yellow recycling bucket, a two handled container, a compostable brown lawn bag or a trash bag left untied at the curb. Maximum weight for each bag or container is 40 pounds. A maximum of 20 bags per week is allowed.

November 1 - March 14: GTPW collects EVERY WEEK on your regular recycling day with the exception of Friday which will be picked up on Thursday. GTPW will not accept trash bags. Grass clippings generated by a commercial landscaper will not be collected.

LEAVES will be collected as follows: 1/1-3/14 - GTPW collects EVERY WEEK on your regular recycling day with the exception of Friday which will be picked up on Thursday. 3/15-10/31 - GTMUA collects WEEKLY on the same day as your regular recycling day. Put leaves in a two handled container, a compostable brown lawn bag or a trash bag left untied at the curb. Maximum weight for each bag or container is 40 pounds with a maximum of 20 bags per week. 11/1-12/31 - GTPW collects according to the fall leaf schedule. Residents are reminded to rake their leaves to the curbside only during the fall and spring leaf schedule.

STUMPS are collected every 3-4 weeks. Residents are to notify the Public Works Department at 228-3144 prior to pick-up.

BRUSH must be cut into 4ft lengths and tied into bundles not to exceed 40 pounds (as per Ordinance). Brush will be collected by Public Works every week on your regular recycling day with the exception of Friday which will be picked up on Thursday.

SOD & GARDEN/LAWN DEBRIS must be in a separate brown lawn bag or container from grass/leaves. This collection by Public Works is every week on your regular recycling day with the exception of Friday which will be picked up on Thursday. Make sure any bucket used, has two handles and is no larger than 32-gallons. Keep brush/debris separate from grass clippings and leaves. Grass clippings and leaves can be mixed as the GTMUA recycles those into organic compost.

FIREWOOD residents are to notify Public Works at 228-3144 prior to pick-up.

ELECTRONICS: Waste Management Act makes it mandatory to recycle all electronics. Household electronics may be dropped off at the Public Works building. Public Works drop off hours are 8am-4pm, Monday - Thursday. Proof of residency required. Residents must call GTPW by Tuesday 4pm to schedule a Wednesday curbside pickup. **WHITE GOODS:** refrigerators, freezers, stoves, ovens, washers, dryers, water heaters and air conditioners are collected every Wednesday. Residents should call Public Works by Tuesday at 4pm to schedule a Wednesday curbs of all appliances prior to leaving at curbside.

MOTOR OIL, CAR BATTERIES AND ANTI-FREEZE, may be brought to the Public Works Department.

CONCRETE, BRICK OR RUBBLE a limited amount may also be disposed of at Public Works, but there is no curbside pick-up of this material. Residents must show proof of Township residency and job-site verification.

SPECIAL WASTE includes automotive liquids, chemicals, fuels, household cleaners, paint related products (oil paints), pesticides and solvents. These hazardous materials cannot be disposed of with your regular trash. The Camden County Division of Environmental Affairs will take your hazardous materials. Please check their website camdencounty.com or call 856-858-5241 for drop-off dates. One will be held in Gloucester Twp at Camden County College. **Water based only latex paint** (cleans up with soap & water) can be disposed of in your regular trash once it's dried out. To achieve the drying out technique; put a strong plastic bag in a cardboard box, then place kitty litter or sand into the plastic bag. Pour the water based paint into the plastic bag. If needed, add more kitty litter or sand. When the paint is dried out, tie the plastic bag and discard into the trash. When the inside of the empty paint can is hardened, you may dispose of it in the regular trash with the lid off. **Syringes & Needles** DO NOT RECYCLE. Use a needle clipper (from pharmacy). After clipping off the needle put in an old coffee can or detergent bottle and seal original lid shut with duct tape. Write on container, "syringes-do not recycle" and throw in trash. **Medication** may be disposed of at the Police Station and Municipal Building. They have a mail box slot that is to be used to discard unwanted medications.

TRASH COLLECTION will continue on the present schedule. If you have any questions call Waste Management at 1-800-633-9096. Account # 49856022. Only two (2) tires per household with the metal rims removed, will be collected on your weekly trash day. Sinks and Toilets will be picked up at curbside on your weekly trash day.
