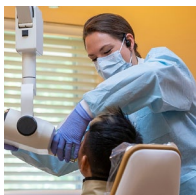

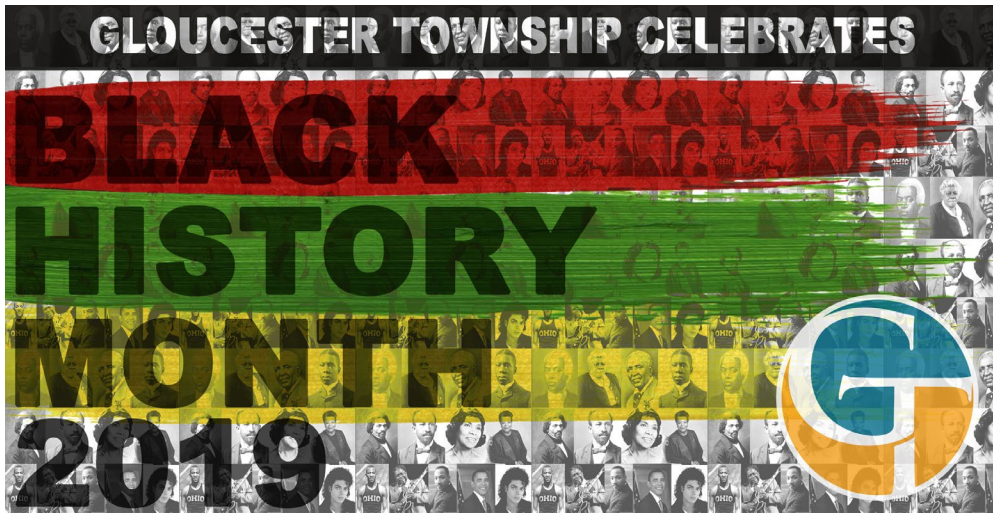

The New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police (NJSACOP) awarded certification status to deserving police executives across the state at the February 6th State Meeting for Chiefs. Achieving Command Executives join a select group, only 33% of state police chiefs are certified and only 29% of municipalities have certified command executives. Gloucester Township Police Department's Chief David J. Harkins, Deputy Chief Anthony Minosse and Captain Brian McKendry recently underwent peer reviews conducted by the NJSACOP Accredited Chief/Command Executive (ACE) Program and successfully earned the following designations:
