




What is the 2020 Census?

The 2020 Census counts every person living in the United States as well as the five US territories. The 2020 Census will mark the 24th time that the country has counted its population since 1790. The count is mandated by the Constitution and conducted by the US Census Bureau, a nonpartisan government agency. You can expect to receive an invitation to respond to a short questionnaire in the mail between March 12-20. You can respond to the questionnaire online, by phone, or by mail.

Why They Conduct the Census

The census provides critical data that is used to provide daily services, products, and support for you and your community. Every year, billions of dollars in federal funding go to schools, fire departments, roads, senior services, job training and many other resources based on census data. The 2020 Census will determine how this funding flows to communities just like ours.

You Count, I count, We all Count!

Participating in the census is required by law, even if you recently completed another survey from the Census Bureau. A complete and accurate count is critical for our community because the result of the 2020 Census will affect community funding, congressional representation, and much more.

During the 2020 Census, the Census Bureau will never ask you for...

- Your Social Security number
- Money or donations
- Anything on behalf of a political party
- Your bank or credit card account numbers

Additionally, there is no citizenship question on the 2020 Census. If someone claiming to be from the Census Bureau contacts you via email or phone and asks you for one of these things, it's a scam, and you should not cooperate.

What Happens to Your Answers?

It is important to know that your personal information collected during the census is kept confidential. The Census Bureau is bound by federal law to protect your information, and your data is used only for statistical purposes.

Dear Residents,

Over the past several days there have been many updates regarding Coronavirus cases spreading throughout the world. On Monday, Governor Murphy declared a state of emergency for the State of New Jersey. Here in Gloucester Township I have been working closely with members of our Office of Emergency Management team, the Gloucester Township Police Department, AMR EMS, Gloucester Township Public Schools, Black Horse Pike Regional School District, and the Camden County Health Department to ensure the public health and safety of our residents.

We have updated the municipal website with current information about the status of the virus as well as any event cancellations taking place in our township. We advise you to also monitor our social media channels for additional updates and cancellations.

At this point we know that some people are at higher risk of getting sick; this includes older adults and people who have serious chronic medical conditions.


THROWBACK THURSDAY
