The Township will be evaluating the reopening of the Municipal Offices on a week-to week basis.

"Police departments around New Jersey have now had to change how they conduct business so that they can keep officers and the public safe

from potential coronavirus exporsure.

Gloucester Township Police have implemented a new way to file reports and are urging the town's residents to take advantage of it.

'I've been a police officer for 25 years. There are things that we're doing that I would never have considered doing,' says Police Chief David Harkins.

But Harkins says that as the number of COVID-19 cases in the state increase, police departments like his are adapting. He says that it starts by doing what many in New Jersey are doing -- extra sanitizing and social distancing.

'We're only going into houses, residences and buildings that we have to,' Harkins says. 'Obviously in police work, we have to if there's a domestic violence situation or some kind of crime or burgarly or even a serious medical condition situation. We're going in.'

Gloucester Township Police officers are responding to emergency calls as usual but the chief asked that if a resident does have a situation where they just need to file a report, they can do so online or at their kisok in the building to limit exposure.

Patrolman Erica Marconi describes options online and at the kiosk.

'It gives you an array of different things that you can report, so identify theft, different types of harassment, criminal mischief, lost property. Reports for insurance purposes -- crashes, anything like that,' she says.

'It limits our interaction, personal interaction and it still gets investigated 100%. You'll still be contacted by an officer who's going to completely investigate it. If we have to make contact we will,' Harkins says."

Public Works Sanitizes Public Playgrounds & Buildings In Town

Gloucester Township Public Works' employees have been working diligently, making sure they continue to sanitize township locations in hopes to stop the spread of COVID-19 and keep our community safe.

For the safety of our residents, Gloucester Township has closed all playgrounds and public bathrooms. Park locations will remain open as outdoor-only facilities during regular operating hours.

Centers for Disease Control (CDC) have issued suggested social safety precautions for large gatherings: remain six feet away from others, refrain from coming into direct contact with others, and avoid touching any surfaces. Signs with these suggested precautions have been posted in the parks around town.
