Gloucester Township Council has scheduled an emergency meeting to consider a resolution to extend the grace period for payment of property taxes through Monday, June 1st. No interest will be charged through June 1st. Action will take place on Monday, May 4th.

All Gloucester Township park walking paths and trails will reopen on Friday, May 1st. Protect yourself and others: please wear a cloth face covering and maintain social distance (6 feet is recommended by the CDC). Please note that playgrounds and fields will **remain closed**. Group play at township parks is **prohibited**.

Retrievr to Resume Services on Monday, May 4th

Collection is completely contact-free: just leave your bags on your porch. Visit retrievr.com or text PICKUP to 757-70-FETCH to schedule your pickup.

Please note that for your safety during COVID-19:

-All pickups will be contactless

-Retrievr will reach out to confirm that you have the ability to leave your items on your porch or outside your garage

-For your safety/the safety of the driver, they are suspending the "Ring" option and ask that you NOT meet the driver at your door -All employees must pass a temperature check (under 100.4) before reporting for work

-Retrievr provides drivers with face masks, safety glasses, and gloves

GTPD Wants You to Watch for Family Emergency Scams

The Gloucester Township Police Department and other Police Departments across the region have recently received several fraud complaints related to Family Emergency Scams.

Scammers may pose as relatives or friends, calling or sending messages to urge you to wire money immedi-

ately. They'll say they need cash to help with an emergency — like getting out of jail, paying a hospital bill, or needing to leave a foreign country. Their goal is to trick you into sending money before you realize it's a scam.

Verify an Emergency | If someone calls or sends a message claiming to be a family member or a friend desperate for money:

-Resist the urge to act immediately, no matter how dramatic the story is.

-Verify the person's identity by asking questions that a stranger couldn't possibly answer.


-Call a phone number for your family member or friend that you know to be genuine.

-Check the story out with someone else in your family or circle of friends, even if you've been told to keep it a secret.

-Don't wire money — or send a check or money order by overnight delivery or courier.
