

Gloucester Township Police Traffic Safety Advisory: Intoxicated Driver Arrests Increase & GTPD's DWI Zero Tolerance Policy

As our State begins to re-open, Gloucester Township Police and area police departments have noticed that traffic has been increasing. This has led to increased crash investigations, speeding, and careless driving complaints. Unfortunately, we have also seen an increase in intoxicated drivers.

O-DRIVE SOBER OR GET PULLED OVER

Intoxicated drivers not only endanger themselves but the lives of every other motorist they may

encounter on the road. Over the past week, Gloucester Township Police have arrested five intoxicated drivers. Out of those five drivers, two of them were involved in motor vehicle crashes and two other drivers were intoxicated by over three times the legal limit.

Gloucester Township Police has a ZERO TOLERANCE policy when it comes to driving while intoxicated; so we please ask you to use caution if you decide to drink. Identify a designated driver or use a rideshare app to get you safely home.

We care about you and your safety, and we are always here to protect you, so please play it safe and don't drink while intoxicated!

Gloucester Township Police Community Safety Tip: Hot Car Interiors Can Kill A Dog very Quickly

WARM WEATHER PET SAFETY: HOW HOT IS YOUR CAR?



Even on a moderately warm day, the inside of a car can heat up in minutes, putting the life of a dog in danger. In general, it's best to leave pets at home in summertime if you have to go into a store or if there is a possibility you might have to leave them alone. While they may love jumping in the car when you do errands, give it a second thought before taking them for the ride for the next couple of months. Leaving a dog in the car for 10 minutes while you run into the grocery store can be extremely dangerous in hot weather.

Dogs do not perspire the way humans do; so the way they maintain a safe body temperature is through panting and also by releasing heat through the pads of their feet — which becomes increasingly challenging on hot car seats, or even on asphalt.

If you see a dog left alone in a hot car, take down the car's color, model, make, and license plate number. Have the owner paged in the nearest buildings, or call local humane authorities or police. Have someone keep an eye on the dog. Don't leave the scene until the situation has been resolved.
