Gloucester Township Playgrounds Re-Open, Indoor Dining Postponed

All Gloucester Township playgrounds are set to re-open on Thursday, July 2nd, according to Governor Murphy's executive order. We ask that you please maintain a social distance (6 feet is recommended), wash or sanitize hands before and after equipment use, and most importantly stay home if you do not feel well in order to keep our community safe.

Indoor dining, which was also set to resume on Thursday, has officially been postponed indefinitely due to concerns of significant spikes in COVID-19 cases. Outdoor dining will continue; however, please keep practicing social distancing and wear a mask if you walk away from your table.

We thank all of our residents who are following the rules and helping keep Gloucester Township a healthy and safe place to live.



FIREWORKS SAFETY TIPS FROM THE GTPD:

July is synonymous with barbecues, the Fourth of July, and of course fireworks. The National Safety Council advises everyone to enjoy fireworks at public displays conducted by professionals, and not to use any fireworks at home. They may be *legal* but they are NOT *safe*.

According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, in 2018 five people died and over 9,100 were injured badly enough to require medical treatment after fireworks-related incidents. Children younger than 15 years of age accounted for 36 percent of the estimated injuries. Similar to 2017, nearly half of the estimated emergency department treated, fireworks-related injuries were to individuals younger than 20 years of age. And while the majority of these incidents were due to amateurs attempting to use professional-grade, homemade or other illegal fireworks or explosives, an estimated 33% were from less powerful devices like small firecrackers and sparklers.

Additionally, fireworks start an average of 18,500 fires each year, including 1,300 structure fires and 300 vehicle fires.

If consumer fireworks are legal to buy where you live and you choose to use them, be sure to follow the following safety tips:

- Never allow young children to handle fireworks
- Older children should use them only under close adult supervision
- · Never use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol
- · Anyone using fireworks or standing nearby should wear protective eye wear
- Never hold lighted fireworks in your hands
- Never light them indoors
- Only use them away from people, houses and flammable material
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person
- Only light one device at a time and maintain a safe distance after lighting
- Never ignite devices in a container
- Do not try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks
- Soak both spent and unused fireworks in water for a few hours before discarding
- Keep a bucket of water nearby to fully extinguish fireworks that don't go off or in case of fire
- Never use illegal fireworks

Better yet, grab a blanket and a patch of lawn, kick back and let the experts handle the fireworks show!

New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission

NJ Motor Vehicle Commission In-Person License and Vehicle Transactions Starts July 7th

The NJMVC announced last Friday that most in-person transactions scheduled to start on June 29th, will be delayed until July 7th. However, road tests and inspections began on June 29th.

More updates from NJMVC:

- •Most licenses, IDs, registrations, and other documents scheduled to expire after March 13 have been extended to July 31 or later (more info at NJMVC.gov).
- •Starting July 7, designated Licensing Centers will be processing new licenses and permits, out-of-state transfers, and REAL ID for those whose appointments were canceled.
- •Starting July 7, designated Vehicle Centers will be adding individual registration and title transactions.

Transactions that can be done online will not be available in person until further notice.

The Commission continues to urge customers to use NJMVC.gov to renew or replace licenses, renew or replace registrations, or change their address.
