In the last month since applications opened for the Camden County CARES Small Business Grant Program, the Camden County Freeholder Board has put \$6.9 million of emergency grant funding into the hands of local proprietors. To date, more than 2,800 applications have been submitted to receive aid, including 151 since a \$5 million expansion to the program was announced two weeks ago. More than 1,080 applications have already been approved and have received or are awaiting their funds.

The Camden County CARES Grant Program made available \$25 million of federal funds from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, to assist struggling businesses during the COVID-19 pandemic. The program is continuing to award and distribute funds on a first come, first served basis. Applications can be submitted at <u>camdencountycares.com</u> until all available funds have been awarded.
