## CAMDEN COUNTY FREEHOLDER BOARD ANNOUNCES DRIVE-THRU FLU SHOT SCHEDULE

As our region continues to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, limiting the spread of seasonal influenza will be critical to protecting public health in Camden County this fall. To help keep residents safe and healthy this flu season, the Camden County Freeholder Board is announcing the 2020 Seasonal Flu Shot Schedule, beginning on Friday, October 2nd. In order to accommodate social distancing recommendations, this year's flu shot program will be conducted via a series of drive-thru events at locations throughout the county.



"It is always important for our residents to protect themselves and their families by getting vaccinated, but with our battle against COVID-19 still in full effect, it is especially important in 2020," said Freeholder Carmen Rodriguez, liaison to the Health Department. "The flu is a dangerous illness, just like COVID-19, and patients frequently require hospitalization for treatment. A sudden surge in flu-related hospitalizations could reduce our health care system's capacity to care for COVID-19 patients and endanger folks who would otherwise be treatable. We can save lives and keep our hospital beds open by preventing and limiting the spread of the flu, and that starts with as many residents as possible receiving their flu shot."

Each fall, the county offers a number of times and locations throughout the county where residents can receive the influenza vaccine, at no out-of-pocket cost. Visit the link below for this year's schedule:

The First Day of School is not only exciting for first time students and teachers, but it's also exciting for brand new School Resource Officers as well!


