Freeholders Launch Rental Assistance Program

The Freeholder Board is launching a new program aimed at supporting renters at risk of losing their homes or facing an eviction threat due to lost employment or income caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Camden County Rental Assistance Program makes available up to six months of back rent (April 2020 through September 2020) for a maximum of \$4,000. While tenants will apply to take part in the program, payments will be made directly to landlords.

"This program will be another significant benefit to business owners who have gone months without rental payments," said Christina Renna, CEO and President of the S.J. Chamber of Commerce. "Our members have been in a holding pattern since the start of the pandemic and this initiative is a win-win for the tenant and landlord."

...more than 60 percent of water pollution comes from things like motor oil, fertilizers, pet waste, and detergents?

So what's the problem with pet waste? Rain can wash pet waste that sits on a lawn or unpaved surface into storm drains, ultimately ending up in our lakes, rivers and the ocean. Pet waste contains coliform bacteria and other pollutants that can make people sick, and often cause beach closures on lakes or the ocean.

YOU CAN HELP: Use newspaper, plastic bags, or a pooper-scooper to pick up the waste when you walk your pet; properly dispose of pet waste into the trash or toilet. (Do NOT dispose of newspaper or plastic bags in the toilet); do not dispose of pet waste in storm drains.

If you are in one of the quarantined counties of Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, Hunterdon, Mercer, Salem, Somerset or Warren, you <u>DO NOT need</u> to contact the New Jersey Department of Agriculture about Spotted Lanternfly sightings. Spotted Lanternfly locations in unquarantined counties in New Jersey can be reported to the Department by emailing slf-plantindustry@ag.nj.gov or by calling 609-406-6943.

The Department appreciates residents reporting the addresses of Spotted Lanternfly sightings and assisting in keeping this pest from spreading.

If you are able to eliminate the Spotted Lanternfly, please do so.
