## Gloucester Township To Expand the Health and Fitness Trail

Please be advised that there's a public meeting scheduled regarding the expansion of Gloucester Township Health and Fitness Trail on December 7th at 6:30 pm at the Municipal Hall. The meeting will be facilitated by the Township Engineer, Anthony Chadwell, of Remington & Vernick Engineers, Inc.

Gloucester Township Health and Fitness trail runs along an abandoned railroad bed. Starting in 1999, the existing trail has been constructed in eleven segments and now extends from Main Street near Grenloch Lake to Oak Avenue.

When completed, the trail will be approximately 4.4 miles in Gloucester Township and will connect the Township's northern border with Runnemede Borough to the southern border with Washington Township.

The trail will generally include a ten-foot-wide pavement with side striping. Signage and striping will be provided at each street crossing. Fencing will be installed wherever steep drop-offs pose a potential safety hazard. Parts of the trail are in old cuts excavated by the railroad and retaining walls will be set approximately five feet from the edge of the trail.



## Gloucester Township To Expand the Health and Fitness Trail


The final segment includes the crossing of the North Branch of Timber Creek.

The trail will occupy the old Reading-Seashore Railroad bed that crosses the creek on a high constructed embankment which will require higher cost per linear foot to provide stabilization and safety features.

Once completed, it will offer excellent vistas of Timber Creek. Both the existing and proposed trail go through several communities in Gloucester Township. It is near or adjacent to several schools, recreational facilities and commercial centers. It will also contribute to the redevelopment of the Black Horse Pike Corridor. Parts of the trail area also adjacent to undeveloped natural parts of the Township. This overall trail is an important part of the Circuit Trails and will eventually serve as a link between the multi-use trail networks in Camden County and Gloucester County. The Circuit Trails are endorsed as a regional priority in the DVRPC's Connections 2045 Plan for Greater Philadelphia.

Thank you to Camden County College President Borden, Security Chief John Schuck, and all of the staff of Camden County College who allowed us to have this important ceremony.

There has never been a time during this crisis, when I have not been able to reach him and consult with him, and for this I thank him.

In addition I want to recognize my Command Staff, Captain Brian McKendry, Captain Brendan Barton, and Captain John Stollsteimer, who have carried out the directives and continue to provide leadership in the face of these difficult times.

The Lieutenants and Sergeants have had an instrumental role in keeping our officers safe, and to provide leadership and guidance on these great examples of police work that we will hear about today.
