Gloucester Township 2021 Reorganization Meeting

On Monday, January 4th, 2021, the Gloucester Township Reorganization Meeting took place in the Council Chambers at the municipal building. The Reorganization Meeting is an annual set-up of rules, regulations, standards, as well as board appointments for the upcoming year. Township Council reelected Orlando Mercado and Tracey Trotto to their positions of Council President and Vice President. Congratulations!



Deadline to Apply for the Senior Freeze Property Tax Reimbursement Extended

Eligible Applicants Now Have Until February 1st to Apply for Relief. State Treasurer Elizabeth Maher Muoio announced that New Jersey property owners who are eligible for the Senior Freeze property tax reimbursement program will have an additional month to apply for the relief program, with the application deadline now being extended until February 1, 2021.

New Jersey's Senior Freeze program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled individuals for increases in property taxes or mobile home park site fees on their principal residence. The COVID-19 pandemic has presented ongoing challenges in obtaining the paperwork needed from local governments in order to complete the application, prompting Treasury's Division of Taxation to extend the deadline for a second time. In October, Treasury initially announced that the deadline was being extended from November 2, 2020 to December 31, 2020.

"We have heard from concerned residents that obtaining the required documentation in time has been a challenge due to the pandemic," said Treasurer Muoio. "That means there may be many eligible seniors who have not taken advantage of the Senior Freeze this year. We want to make sure, now more than ever, that eligible taxpayers have access to this vital resource."

The Senior Freeze program is designed to "freeze" the burden of increasing real estate taxes for qualified applicants by establishing a base year of eligibility and comparing that base with any subsequent year. The difference is then refunded by the State annually. In order to qualify for the reimbursement, taxpayers must meet all the eligibility requirements for each year from the base year through the current application year. Eligibility must be continuous otherwise a new base year must be established.

Applications for the current 2019 Senior Freeze were mailed in February to the last address taxpayers filed with. Anyone who did not receive a booklet should contact the New Jersey Division of Taxation's Senior Freeze Property Tax Reimbursement Information Line for assistance at 1-800-882-6597 (The U.S. Postal Service does not forward application booklets).

The Division of Taxation began issuing payments on October 15 and will continue to do so on an ongoing basis as applications are received. Applicants can check the status/amount of their Senior Freeze reimbursement for 2017, 2018, and 2019 online.

The FRC is a home of the GT Vision Program and other youth centered activities in the community.


We provide professional counseling services in a comfortable, home-like setting. Individual and family counseling is offered free of charge to community families struggling with issues affecting our youth.



Did you receive a new doorbell camera and/ or CCTV cameras as a gift this past holiday?


Register your cameras with Gloucester Township Police!

The Gloucester Township Police Department is requesting residents, businesses, and organizations that have security cameras in place on their property to complete a short registration form. The registration DOES NOT give the Gloucester Township Police Department access to your camera system, and only allows our agency to maintain a data base reference of active cameras in the event a crime occurs in the area.

For example, if a burglary occurs down the street from your property, GTPD would know your camera may have captured an image of a vehicle or suspect that could connect GTPD to the suspects involved in the burglary. A detective would be able to contact you and ask to review the footage in hopes of identifying a suspect description or any information that can help the case. Registration is voluntary and there is no cost associated with it.

The SLEO I officers perform duties such as day detail assignments, court security, council room security, hall duty, park patrol, security and/or traffic control at special events or emergencies, deployment of traffic control devices, transportation of township vehicles for maintenance and school/church crossing assignments, and/or any other law enforcement duty as deemed appropriate by the Chief of Police. Part-time hours vary between days, nights, and weekends.
