Gloucester Township's Winter Storm Update

A high-impact winter storm hit Northeast region late Sunday night and brought 9 to 11 inches of snow to Gloucester Township.

Department of Public Works started preparing for the storm well in advance brining all of the Township's streets starting Friday morning of last week. They made sure their snow machinery was operational, and all of the 33 pieces of snow equipment were up and running ready for the upcoming weather. Contractors were called and put on stand-by with additional 75 pieces of snow plowing equipment.

Sunday night – first round of the storm hit, and Public Works were out all night salting and keeping up with the snow.

Late afternoon on Monday – the second round of the storm hit bringing yet more of the heavy snow; and, at this point, the contractors and PW were working hand-in-hand around the clock alternating shifts to make sure the town's roads were clear as much as possible and safe for the residents.

As of right now, Department of Public Works is still clearing up the streets and should be done with the aftermath of this winter storm by tonight.

A total of 550 tons of salt and thousands of gallons of brine were used in preparation for and during the storm.

Gloucester Township thanks our Public Works Department for their amazing work at keeping our town safe, clean, and drivable!

GTPD SCAM ADVISORY

Please SHARE with your family, especially older members, as Gloucester Township Police Detectives continue to investigate a variety of scams involving GIFT CARDS as payment:

Phone Scams were the most lucrative type of scam targeted at older people, and GIFT CARDS became the most popular payment method demanded by scammers. Those scams involve technical support, law enforcement, IRS and taxes, prizes, sweepstakes and lotteries, and impersonations of family and friends.

Keep it simple: advise your family members that the moment someone requests or demands GIFT CARDS as payment or bail- HANG UP THE PHONE.

DON'T BE THE VICTIM OF A GIFT CARD SCAM!


For your protection:

- Is someone calling claiming to be a family member in trouble?
- Are you being asked to purchase large sums of gift cards?
- Is someone claiming to be the IRS?
- Are you being pressured to buy gift cards to pay your taxes?

Remember:

- Gift cards cannot be used to pay for legal fees or bail.
- Gift cards cannot be used to pay taxes OR to fix computer viruses.
- Do not share card numbers or PINS with anyone.
- Do not get scammed. Report any of the above to local authorities.
