Gloucester Township Police Department has destroyed over 360 lbs of prescription drugs that were dropped off at the dropbox at Gloucester Township Police Headquarters!



Limited Vaccinations Available for South Jersey Veterans



The Camden County Office of Veterans Affairs and the Corporal Michael J. Crescenz VA Medical Center in Philadelphia are teaming up to create a second pop-up vaccination site for approximately 800 South Jersey veterans on Saturday, March 27. Vaccinations will be provided at the Harry Williams Community Center located at the intersection of North Black Horse Pike and Broadway in Runnemede.

Vaccinations will be available by appointment only between 7:45 a.m. and 2:15 p.m. Eligible veterans can call (215) 823-4014 to make an appointment until all available slots have been filled.

The following conditions must be met to be considered eligible:

- Must be a veteran (no spouses or relatives at this time)
- Must be already enrolled for VA benefits
- Must be at least 55 years of age

"Last month's pop-up vaccination clinic was incredibly successful and got vaccines into the arms of roughly 590 area veterans," said County Commissioner Melinda Kane, liaison to the Office of Veterans Affairs. "We are extremely thankful for our partners at the VA for making it possible to provide a second round of appointments and to continue providing these services to men and women who served their country. As our community gets closer to returning to a prepandemic state, getting these heroes protected is vitally important."

GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP POLICE ADVISORY: ATVS and DIRT BIKES

This time of year, every year, Gloucester Township Police begins to receive increasing numbers of complaints by community members about the illegal use of ATV and dirt bike riding throughout the Township.

Most wooded areas in Gloucester Township are PRIVATE PROPERTY and illegal to ride off road vehicles. GTPD will be enforcing the use of off road vehicles in Gloucester Township, riders will be ticketed, and their vehicle can be towed and impounded.

Violators may be charged in violation of Local Ordinance 82-1 and New Jersey State Traffic Laws, which also prohibit operation of these recreational vehicles.

Gloucester Township Police Officer Spotlight: Captain Brendan Barton



Captain Brendan Barton was hired by the Gloucester Township Police Department in 1999 and attended Class 30 of the Camden County College Police Academy. In 2001 he became a DARE instructor, taught DARE in numerous public and private schools, and became a Shift Investigator. He served as a Sergeant in the Patrol Bureau from 2006-2010 until being named the Community Relations Bureau Commander in the newly created Community and Personnel Services Division. During this time he supervised numerous new programs such as the Junior Police Academy and Bike Safety Rodeos. In 2012 he was promoted to Lieutenant and to Captain in 2016 and served in the Community Services Division and Operations Division. Captain Barton was named Supervisor of the year in 2016. He also became one of the first Law Enforcement Against Drugs and Violence LEAD instructors in the State of New Jersey and remains a member of the LEAD Advisory Board. In 2013, Captain Barton graduated from the NJ State Association of Chiefs of Police Command and Leadership course.

Captain Barton grew up in Gloucester Township, New Jersey and attended Chews Elementary School, Glen Landing Middle School and graduated from Triton High School in 1994. He then attended Stockton University and received a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice in 1998. In 1995 he joined Magnolia Fire Company as a volunteer firefighter and held various positions during his career.

Captain Barton enjoys spending time with his family, playing and coaching sports and traveling.


