Gloucester Township Dedicates a Walkway to World Autism Awareness Day

On Friday, April 2, at a press conference outside the Municipal Building, Chief David Harkins and Mayor David Mayer proudly revealed a beautiful installation by PAVERART designed to recognize Autism and Neurodiversity.

The project started in late 2019 when Gloucester Township resident and parent of a child with Autism, Mrs. Tiffany Scovern, approached PAVERART owner Mark Olivito and General Manager Mike Bull about creating a paver project to recognize Autism and Neurodiversity. They then approached the Gloucester Township Police, because of their ADDR registry, to collaborate and celebrate Neurodiversity.

PAVERART designed the artwork and Gloucester Township Mayor David Mayer authorized it to be installed in a prominent place so that more people would see it which would then create conversation. PAVERART then delivered the pavers and materials for this project to be installed by the Gloucester Township Public Works Department.

PAVERART is a small locally owned business located in Lindenwold, NJ, that specializes in custom designed hardscapes. They have been in business for the last 18 years and have partnered with Landscape Architects, Designers, Contractors, Municipalities, Pro Sports Teams, Schools, Commercial Organizations, non-profits and homeowners.

About ADDR Registry:

In 2015 The Gloucester Township Police Department created a registry for individuals with Autism or disabilities designed to give police officers a quick access to a person's critical information in an emergency situation.

The Autism/Development Disability Registry (ADDR) provides police with emergency contact information, detailed physical descriptions, known routines, favorite attractions or special needs of an individual with Autism Spectrum Disorder or other disabilities such as: Alzheimer's, Dementia, Down Syndrome or any other endangered individuals. This information can greatly assist police officers when time is essential in communicating and dealing with an emergency situation.

"I myself am a parent of a special needs child, so I know about some of the worries that parents have. It's always helpful for our police officers to know what we are responding to, so in 2015 we started a registry through a community outreach to gather information about a special needs person whether it would be an adult or a child." Should an officer respond to an emergency, the officer will be immediately told by a dispatcher about the person on a registry so that the officer will know how to handle the situation in a particular case. "The more information we know, the better we can handle the situation. So I couldn't be more proud of this Paverart project that we hope is going to stir a conversation. We hope that everyone sees that we are acceptive of everyone in our community – it's what makes Gloucester Township such a great place," said Chief David Harkins.

"Today we will be unveiling a beautiful walkway that will promote Autism awareness as well as respect, tolerance, and inclusion. I want to thank Tiffany for her inspiration, and Mark and Mike for the design. On average about 1 in 54 children are affected by Autism; and my friends and colleagues who have children with Autism often tell me how stressful, overwhelming, and isolating it can be, and how it affects every part of their life. But the fact is that although those families might not be prepared for where life is taking them, nonetheless, that journey and that experience are just as beautiful. And today we are going to start a dialogue for families and children with Autism and for those affected by Autism about respect, tolerance, and inclusion," said Mayor David Mayer.

The following documents will be needed for registration

- 1. Original Birth Certificate
- 2. Immunization Record
- 3. Custody Papers (if applicable)
- 4. Two Proofs of Residency If you own or are buying your home, please bring your sale agreement, or current tax bill and a current utility bill. If you are renting, please bring a copy of your current lease and a current utility bill. If you are living with someone else (family member, friend, etc.), please bring a notarized affidavit, current tax bill and a current utility bill for the owner. You must also provide two additional proofs of residency (current bill, address change notice from the post office, or bank statement) along with the affidavit.
- 5. Immunization Records
- DPT minimum of four doses. One dose must be administered on or after the fourth birthday.
- Polio minimum of three doses. One must be given on or after the fourth birthday.
- MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) two doses of measles-containing vaccine given on or after the first birthday
- Hepatitis B -three doses
- Varicella (chicken pox) one dose. Additionally, all children will be required to have a complete physical given by their family physician prior to entering kindergarten in September.
