A Resident, Gianna Vennell, Paints a Mural as a Thank You to Everyone in her Town!

On Monday, August 23rd, Mayor Mayer visited an unveiling of a Mural in Glendora section of Gloucester Township.

Gianna Vennell, a resident of Glendora section of our Township, is a local artist who always wanted to give back to her community. In 2013 Gianna won the Gloucester Township "Woman Who Makes a Difference" award for her Hats for the Homeless charity that she started at the age of 10.

At the beginning of August Gianna came up with an idea for a beautiful mural "as a thank you to everyone who makes this town/township what it is," says Gianna.

She raised \$900 in supplies (donations from Glendora residents), gathered 20+ volunteers and completed the project in under 2 weeks!

The wall was kindly donated by ServPro, a company specializing in residential and commercial restoration and cleaning services, located at 226 Chestnut St.

"My husband and I were there painting five hours each day. We wanted to create a gathering place for our residents," says Gianna.

- First responder (butterflies on the Pike represent Police, Fire personnel, Dispatchers, and Military)
- local businesses
- the Clock Tower at the Glendora Fire Station
- Gabriel Davies Tavern
- Town's baseball and softball organizations.
