Seeds of Gloucester Township's History for Future Generations went into the ground last weekend

Saturday, September 18, Mayor Mayer and Township Council buried a Time Capsule on the grounds of the historical Gabreil Daveis Tavern in the Glendora section of our town. The event commemorated the 325th anniversary since the township's incorporation in 1695. Local groups and organizations were asked to submit their items of significance along with photos to be dug up in the year 2070.

The ceremony was hosted by Township Council President Orlando Mercado. The speakers included Mayor David Mayer, President of Gloucester Township Historic and Scenic Preservation Committee Sharon Mickle, and John Welsh a resident of Gloucester Township and honorable veteran who turned 101 this year!
