## ***Seeds of Gloucester Township's History for Future Generations went into the ground last weekend***

Saturday, September 18, Mayor Mayer and Township Council buried a Time Capsule on the grounds of the historical Gabreil Daveis Tavern in the Glendora section of our town. The event commemorated the 325th anniversary since the township's incorporation in 1695. Local groups and organizations were asked to submit their items of significance along with photos to be dug up in the year 2070.

The ceremony was hosted by Township Council President Orlando Mercado. The speakers included Mayor David Mayer, President of Gloucester Township Historic and Scenic Preservation Committee Sharon Mickel, and John Welsh a resident of Gloucester Township and honorable veteran who turned 101 this year! *(continued on Page 2)*

## FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Public Works will begin Leaf Collection on November 1, 2021. Look for signs on the road. **Don't Worry!** If you miss your round, we will continue to collect until all leaves are picked up.

### To make this program a success, please adhere to the following:

Try to keep all leaves unbagged at curbside. If you must use bags, **please use paper bags only.**

Have all leaves out the weekend prior to your week.

Rake all leaves curbside. Do not rake leaves into the street if it will block traffic.

Do not mix trash and broken branches with leaves. This clogs the machines and **your leaves will not be picked up.**

Do not park any vehicles in front of leaves during your pick-up week. **They will not be picked up.**
