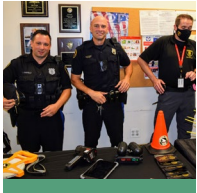

REMINDER-GET YOUR FLU SHOT!



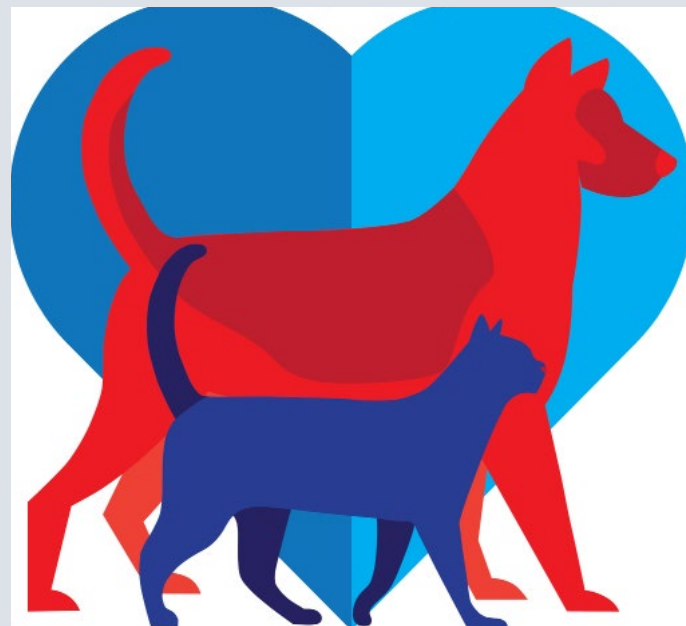
