

Gloucester Township Welcomes K-9 Venus!

Chief David Harkins is happy to announce that the Gloucester Township Police has added a new K-9 Team to the agency with their very first Bloodhound, K-9 Venus, who is now assigned to Patrolman James Evans!

Before being placed into service, both Ptl. Evans and the 11-month old K-9 Venus will be training for 12 intensive weeks at the Cape May County Sheriff's Office Tracking and Trailing Academy. This addition to the GTPD family will enable officers to quickly have a Bloodhound trailing service dog respond and assist with investigations involving missing persons such as young children, those with dementia, suicidal, or those who may have a disability.

Chief Harkins states, "The addition of K-9 Venus will be a valuable resource that will provide us with the ability to enhance our tracking capabilities, alongside our already strong K-9 Unit. We are looking forward to K-9 Venus completing her training and impacting the community of Gloucester Township, New Jersey ."









GTPD ATTENDS EXECUTIVE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT COURSE

Gloucester Township Police Chief David Harkins, Deputy Chief Anthony Minosse, Captain John Stollsteimer, Lieutenant James Schriver, and Lieutenant Daniel Long traveled to Gettysburg National Military Park and attended the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police Gettysburg Leadership Experience, an accredited Chief/Command Executive Professional Development Course.

NJSACOP Law Enforcement Staff Rides transform battlefields and other historic sites into living classrooms to educate modern law enforcement leaders. The issues of command and control, logistics, communication, strategic planning, tactics and leading in times of stress transcend time and place as issues important to leaders of police organizations. This exercise gives police leaders an opportunity to regain focus on the fundamentals of the profession: courage, fortitude, perseverance and selflessness.

The unique design of the program allows for a hands-on, intensive study of the relevance and importance of key leadership issues for today's police leaders through the use of case studies that examine the leadership successes and failures of historical leaders within the actual environment in which they operated.







THIRD DOSE VS BOOSTER SHOT

COVID-19 Third Dose	COVID-19 Booster
(Pfizer and Moderna Only) A third dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine is identical to the first two doses.	A booster dose of Pfizer. (Boosters for Moderna and J&J are not yet approved)
Who gets it? • People with weakened immune systems	Who gets it? • People over age 65 • Long term care residents • Ages 18-64 with medical conditions • Workers at risk due to job
Why get a third dose? A third dose provides added protection for those who are immunocompromised.	Why get a booster dose? To boost protection, since studies show that vaccine protection can decrease overtime.
When to get a third dose? 28 days after 2nd dose.	When to get a booster? At least 6 months after the second dose of Pfizer vaccine.
