# GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT ENCOURAGES RESIDENTS TO USE ONLINE REPORTING SYSTEM

Do you live in Gloucester Township, New Jersey and had a package stolen recently? Report it to Gloucester Township Police using our Online Reporting!

We understand that many companies like Amazon, Walmart, and Target will allow reimbursement for your stolen items without a police report, but your reported information helps our GTPD Patrols and Detectives to pinpoint problem areas, identify, and stop package theft suspects.

Recently we received several reports of package thefts in Gloucester Township apartment complexes, which are currently being investigated. Here are some tips to prevent package theft:

- Always retrieve packages (and mail) as soon as it arrives.
- Reschedule Delivery or Ask for a Package Hold if you're not going to be home.
- Ask Your Neighbors to Grab Your Packages.
- Use a company that provides a tracking service and check online to see when it is scheduled to arrive.

Remember to report any suspicious person and/or act immediately to the Gloucester Township Police Department by calling 9-1-1 for an emergency and 856-228-4500 for a non-emergency.

Camden County Department of Health and Human Services advises municipalities that the region will be under a Code Blue Advisory Friday evening into Wednesday morning.

The Health Officer has issued the Code Blue advisory for Camden County effective from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., beginning Feb. 4 and ending the morning of Feb. 9. Temperatures during the daytime hours on Saturday, Feb. 5 will be at 32 degrees or below. Please note that the new after-hours code blue emergency hotline is 2-1-1.
