Commissioner Carmen Rodriguez, liaison to the Camden County Department of Health and Human Services, advises municipalities that the region will be under a Code Blue Advisory Thursday evening into next week.

The Health Officer has issued the Code Blue advisory for Camden County effective from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., beginning Feb. 10 and ending the morning of Feb. 15. Temperatures during the daytime hours on Monday, Feb. 14 will be at 32 degrees or below. Please note that the new after-hours code blue emergency hotline is 2-1-1.
