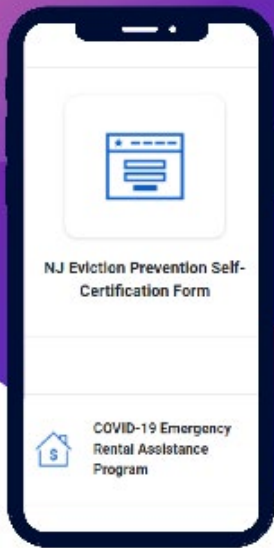

Housing Help NJ is a program funded through grants from the New Jersey Pandemic Relief Fund and the NJ Dept. of Community Affairs - Affordable Housing Trust Fund, and is administered through the Housing and Community Development Network of New Jersey.

The state of New Jersey has a process that may help prevent residents from being evicted or removed from their homes.

Pursuant to enacted legislation, if renters submit a self-certification form, and if they are eligible, they may be protected from being evicted or removed from where they are living at any time for past due rent accrued between March 1, 2020 and either August 31, 2021 or December 31, 2021 depending on income level.

These protections are not automatic. In order to take advantage of these protections, residents **MUST** file an Eviction Prevention Income Self-Certification Form, which can be found here: <https://covid19.nj.gov/pages/renter>. Filling out this certification has the ability to assist renter households with getting their eviction cases dismissed.

The website www.housinghelpnj.org features local, state and federal resources for renters, homeowners & landlords. Housing Help NJ includes a resource library with resource guides categorized by both county and for specific populations.
