Camden County Health Department Issues "Code Blue"



(Gloucester Township, NJ) - Commissioner Carmen Rodriguez, liaison to the Camden County Department of Health and Human Services, advises municipalities that the region will be under a Code Blue Advisory Thursday evening into Saturday.

The Health Officer has issued the Code Blue advisory for Camden County effective from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., beginning March 3 and ending the morning of March 5.

"Please check on anyone in your life who is elderly or disabled to make sure they're prepared to stay safe in these potentially dangerous elements,' Rodriguez said.

With a large portion of households in Camden County owning a cat or a dog Rodriguez wants to ensure that all pets are safe during these extreme temperatures as well.

Council Approves the Gloucester Township Neighborhood Preservation Implementation Plan

On Monday, February 28, Gloucester Township Council approved the resolution adopting the Neighborhood Preservation Program (NPP) Implementation Plan for Gloucester Township Arts District in Downtown Blackwood section of the township.

As a condition of the NPP grant, the NJDCA requires that an Implementation Plan be prepared which outlines the activities of the NPP program and describes the manner in which the grant funds will be expended. The plan covers a one-year period and contains a possible strategy for four years following subsequently and must be submitted to the NJDCA for review and approval prior to program implementation.

The implementation plan has been completed pursuant with the required citizen input and other related State mandates and approved by the NJDCA.





Help GTPD Solve Crime In Your Neighborhood!

The Gloucester Township Police Department is requesting Gloucester Township, New Jersey residents, businesses, and organizations that have security cameras in place on their property to complete a short registration form.

Registration is voluntary and there is no cost associated with registration. The registration DOES NOT give the Gloucester Township Police Department access to your camera system, and only allows our agency to maintain a data base reference of active cameras in the event a crime occurs in

For example if a burglary occurs down the street from your property, we would know your camera may have captured an image of a vehicle or suspect that could connect us to the suspects involved in the burglary. A detective would be able to contact you and ask to review the footage in hopes of identifying a suspect description or any information that can help the case.

Safe Passing Law in Effect

Gloucester Township Police Community Relations Bureau Commander, Lieutenant Melissa Capanna, was interviewed by News 12 New Jersey Reporter Erika Shych earlier today about the new NJ Safe Passing Law, which took effect on March 1st.

The new law provides clear rules of the road for all motorists about when and how to pass people sharing the road on foot, on bicycles, on scooters, wheelchairs or in other legally permitted ways to travel other than a motor vehicle.

The Safe Passing Law requires drivers to use "due caution" whenever they see vulnerable people on the road. The law states that:

- Drivers must follow all current no-passing, no speeding laws AND move over a lane if there's one to move into.
- On a single-lane road, drivers must allow at least a 4-foot safety zone when they pass.
- If 4 feet is not possible on a section of road, drivers must slow to 25mph and be prepared to stop until they can pass safely without endangering those sharing the road.
