Once Superfund Site - Now Producer of Clean Renewable Energy



In partnership with Syncarpha Capital and the Township's Energy Consultant, Blue Sky Power, Gloucester Township broke ground on the 4.5 MW DC GEMS (the Gloucester Environmental Management Services) Solar Park located at the northwest corner of the intersection of Hickstown Road and New

Brooklyn Erial Road. The Solar Park is estimated to produce 6,086,000 kWh of clean zero emissions power per year and yield approximately \$1,000,000 in lease revenue to the Township over 25 years. Construction started last fall and is expected to be finished in Spring 2022.

"We are extremely excited to break ground on the GEMS Solar Park this October. This joint project with Syncarpha Capital will bring about 4.5 MW of clean sustainable energy produced in Gloucester Township. I'm thrilled to see what had been one-of-theworst-polluted superfund sites in the country in the 1980s becoming the shining beacon of renewable energy source in our town!" said Mayor David R. Mayer.

"Transforming one of the nations most polluted landfills into a clean energy producing solar park has been Mayor Mayer's mission for the last nine years. With his leadership and that of the Gloucester Township council, this project and the many solar projects on municipal and school district property have cemented Gloucester Township's place as one the most sustainable communities in the United States, "said Ben Parvey, CEO of Blue Sky Power.

"We are very excited to see this GEMS project finally ready to begin construction. Our partnership with Gloucester Township dates back to 2016 when we were selected as the redeveloper of this former Superfund site. We have worked together tirelessly since then to complete all necessary state, local and environmental permitting as well as the process of interconnecting through Atlantic City Electric to the wholesale electric grid. When construction wraps up in Spring 2022, this 4.5MW solar facility built on a capped Superfund site will turn this environmentally sensitive unproductive real estate into a solar facility producing clean energy for the residents of NJ and income for the Township," said Cliff Chapman, Managing Partner of Syncarpha Capital. The GEMS solar project involves the placement of an approximately 25-acre, non-penetrating solar photovoltaic generation system on top of the existing landfill cap. The equipment to construct the system is composed of photovoltaic solar modules, solar inverters, a steel and aluminum racking system, non-penetrating ballast blocks, transformers and associated wiring/conduits. In order to have a productive renewable use for the nation's first Superfund site, Gloucester Township created the Superfund Redevelopment Area at GEMS landfill 2014. Under a 1985 Consent Decree, the Landfill is undergoing long term remediation, including the operation of a groundwater extraction and pretreatment system, maintenance of the Landfill capping system and the gas extraction and treatment system, and various monitoring programs. Once completed in the Spring of 2022, the clean energy produced at the GEMS Solar Park will annually offset 4,313 metric tons of Carbon Dioxide, which is the equivalent of emissions from 10,839,527 miles driven by a typical passenger vehicle. "It is truly special to be here today to see over 60 acres of the nation's first Superfund site converted into a solar energy park that will produce over 6 million kilowatt hours of clean energy a year," said Senator Steve Sweeney. "When the GEMS Landfill was declared a Superfund site in 1985, it was a problem for Gloucester Township. Now, under this lease agreement, taxpayers will save \$1 million over the next 25 years. This is truly a win-win solution."

Gloucester Township Small Business Assistance Grant Program Update

The Township of Gloucester has appropriated \$425,000 of its federal Community Development Block Grant CARES Funds (CDBG-CV) for the COVID-19 Small Business Assistance Program. The program was established to provide working capital funds to the community's small businesses that have been severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. To date, 44 small businesses of Gloucester Township have been awarded a total of \$360,000; and there are still funds available in the program budget. Application is available at www.GloTwp.com




Gloucester Township Partners with Inspira for EMS

On February 24, 2022, Gloucester Township and Inspira Health held a press conference to announce partnership and long-term contract for emergency services between the provider, the Township, and Borough of Pine Hill. The press event was held at Gloucester Township owned EMS building at 1 Woodshire Drive, in Sicklerville section of the Township. A five-year contract went in affect on April 1, 2022. Two ambulances are now providing around-the-clock 911 service to the residents and visitors of Gloucester Township and are stationed in Erial station (1 Woodshire Dr) and Glendora station (236 Taylor Ave).

"An excellent provision of EMS services is absolutely vital to the health and safety of every community. I am very pleased to welcome Inspira Health to Gloucester Township. Inspira Health has an extensive history of providing quality health care in the South Jersey region; and I look forward to working with them to ensure high quality health care for our residents and visitors," said Mayor Mayer.

GT Awarded Neighborhood Preservation Program Grant

Last fall Gloucester Township was awarded a 5-year designation, including an initial \$125,000 grant from the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs' Neighborhood Preservation Program (NPP). Pending annual State budget capacity, the Arts District in Downtown Blackwood is anticipated to receive up to \$125,000 a year for a total of five



years to assist with economic and community development. In addition to funding, the State's NPP Team of place-based revitalization experts will provide a robust array of technical assistance and training to guide and empower this local effort. The focus will be on revitalizing the Downtown Blackwood section of Gloucester Township.

"I am thrilled to announce that Gloucester Township will be receiving the NPP Grant this year to further enhance and revitalize the Arts District in Blackwood section of Gloucester Township. Though efforts at revitalization have been made in the neighborhood, the support of the NJDCA and the funding available through the Neighborhood Preservation Program will have an enormous positive impact on the community!" said Mayor Mayer.

The program is designed to increase place, economic, civic and social value. It seeks to achieve this by enhancing buildings, streets and a district's entire physical realm, by supporting and coordinating small business recovery, growth and sustainability, and by marketing district events and activities while also engaging local stakeholders in planning and relationship building. The state's NPP Team will work closely with the municipality and the stakeholders to support an array of bottom-up efforts that create visible and tangible change, leverage other public and private resources, and address real needs and aspirations of the Gloucester Township's Arts District stakeholders, including residents and business owners.

An NPP Coordinator with support of a local NPP Stakeholder Team created an NPP Implementation Plan that combines significant community engagement, local knowledge, and hard data. The resulting Implementation Plan is an achievable and comprehensive set of projects and programs that address local needs and build on local assets in its NPP District. GTPD is RapidSOS Ready!



The Gloucester Township Police Department has recently enabled RapidSOS, a solution that provides life-saving data including caller location, health and medical information, connected building and alarm data,

vehicle telematics data, and more - to 911 telecommunicators and first responders in the event of an emergency. With this upgrade, the Gloucester Township Police Department can access accurate caller location and additional life-saving information when responding to 911 calls. This may include emergency contact information, security system alarm information, medical and health information, COVID-19 symptoms and test results, and more.

Gloucester Township residents can also become RapidSOS Ready by creating a free Emergency Health Profile at www.emergencyprofile.org. By doing so, they provide first responders with critical medical information in an emergency to get you the right care at the right time.

Community Notification System

GTPD encourages you to receive important community information. You can receive safety tips, media releases, and police community relations events via email. The GTPD Community Notification System provides greater capabilities to notify our community. Importantly, in this age of instant communication, the GTPD along with the township's Office of Emergency Management must be able to effectively reach residents with road closures, safety warnings or community safety bulletins. Our Community Notification System will give the GTPD the ability to notify thousands of residents, staff members, and volunteers within minutes by sending out text messages and emails instantly. Autism Development Disability Registration

Gloucester Township Police Department has taken steps to better assist our community members with Autism or special needs- we created a sticker that can be placed on your vehicle or near the main entrance to your home that will alert an approaching Police Officer that someone inside could have a special need. We also have seatbelt sleeves that will warn a First Responder during an incident, such as a motor vehicle crash, that the occupant has Autism and may not respond.

The seatbelt sleeves and stickers are free to our Gloucester Township, New Jersey residents. GT Emergency Needs Preparedness Registry

The GTPD has created a voluntary Emergency Needs Preparedness Registry that lets first responders prepare for, and respond to your needs during major emergencies. This has been established to collect information to help assist those with special needs or high risks during an emergency, especially when family, caregivers or others are unable to help them.

Many people may need extra help during a time of emergency including people who:

- Use life support systems such as oxygen, respirator, ventilator, dialysis, pacemaker, or are insulin dependent;
- Have mobility disabilities and use a wheelchair, scooter, walker, cane, or other mobility device;
- · Are visually impaired, blind, hard of hearing, or deaf;
- Have speech, cognitive, developmental or mental health disabilities: or
- Use assistive animals or a prosthesis.

Your information is held confidentially. This notification allows first responders additional time to consider how to best respond to that incident. Please note that strict confidentiality is maintained at all times and only those that have a reason to access the information are authorized to do so. Gloucester Township Police Chief David Harkins Message

"I am very proud to report that the Gloucester Township Police Department has been accepted into the Active Bystandership for Law Enforcement (ABLE) Project™, Georgetown University Law Center's national training and support initiative for U.S. law enforcement agencies committed to building a culture of peer intervention that prevents harm. The goal of the ABLE Project is for officers to look out for each other while performing the high stress duties of law enforcement.

By demonstrating a firm commitment to transformational reform with support from local community groups and elected leaders, Gloucester Township Police Department joins a select group of more than 215 other law enforcement agencies, along with statewide and regional training academies, from across North America.

Backed by prominent civil rights and law enforcement leaders, the evidence-based, field-tested ABLE Project was developed by Georgetown Law's Center for Innovations in Community Safety in collaboration with global law firm Sheppard Mullin LLP to provide practical active bystandership strategies and tactics to law enforcement officers to prevent misconduct, reduce mistakes, and promote health and wellness.

By committing to the principles of the ABLE Project, we provide our officers with additional tools to overcome the innate and powerful inhibitors all individuals face when called upon to intervene in actions taken by their peers. Attaining the ABLE certification was an important priority for us, as we continually work to improve our "Excellence in Policing" and officer wellness initiatives.

I am proud that we received strong support from Mayor David Mayer, Gloucester Township, New Jersey Council, the Dreams of Tomorrow Organization (www.thedotorganization.com), clergy members of Gloucester Township (Our Lady of Hope Parish, Gloucester Township Ministerium), and community leaders to achieve this certification from the ABLE Project.

Professor Christy Lopez, co-director of Georgetown Law's Center for Innovations in Community Safety, which runs ABLE, explained: "The ABLE Project seeks to ensure every police officer in the United States has the opportunity to receive meaningful, effective active bystandership training, and to help agencies transform their approach to policing by building a culture that supports and sustains successful peer intervention to prevent harm."

The ABLE Project is guided by a Board of Advisors comprised of civil rights, social justice, and law enforcement leaders, including Commissioner Michael Harrison of the Baltimore Police Department; Commissioner Danielle Outlaw of the Philadelphia Police Department; Dr. Ervin Staub, professor emeritus at the University of Massachusetts Amherst and the founder of the Psychology of Peace and Justice Program; and an impressive collection of other police leaders, rank and file officers, and social justice leaders.

SOLUTIONS TO STORMWATER POLLUTION

In accordance with our NJDEP Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit, the Twp. adopted various Ordinances to regulate the impact of stormwater runoff and pollutants on the environment.

- **1. Pet Waste**: This requires pet owners to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property. It prevents fecal contamination from impacting the local waterways.
- **2. Litter:** This states it is unlawful to throw, drop, discard or otherwise place litter of any nature upon any public or private property, other than in a litter receptacle. This prevents unsightly & unsanitary conditions & prevent litter from impacting waterways.
- **3. Improper Disposal of Waste:** This states that it is illegal to dispose of waste in any place not specifically designated for the purpose of solid waste storage or disposal. The purpose is to prevents unsanitary conditions and groundwater pollution.
- **4. Wildlife Feeding:** Feeding of water fowl on municipal park property is prohibited by Ordinance. The Township enacted the Ordinance as a method to reduce water fowl population in response to health concerns regarding bacteria which is harmful to humans and fish populations.
- **5. Yard Waste:** Yard waste is regulated by Ordinance which establishes the current zone collection system and the methods of collecting leaves, brush, and other yard waste. The purpose is to keep leaves and grass out of the storm sewer system.
- **6. Illicit Connections:** This makes it unlawful to connect any pipe or device to the municipal storm sewer system that is intended to discard, spill or dump any material other than stormwater runoff or ground water (sump pumps) into the system. The purpose of this Ordinance is to prevent pollution and contamination of waterways which receive discharge from our storm sewers.

The transport of pollutants into local water bodies destroys fish, wildlife and habitats; threatens public health and causes the loss of recreational and aesthetic value. We have enacted these Ordinances to protect our environment, and to keep pollutants that are commonly conveyed by stormwater from adversely impacting our waterways and groundwater supplies.

NO GRASS CLIPPINGS IN STREETS

Please keep grass clippings out of the street and our waterways. It is against DEP state and local regulations. The grass clippings clog our storm waterways and put toxic chemicals into our waterways.


