HEAT ADVISORY ISSUED IN GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP



The Camden County Health Officer has issued a heat advisory for our region effective Thursday, August 4 and Friday, August 5 from 12 p.m. to 7 p.m. both days. During a heat advisory, the combination of hot temperatures and high humidity will combine to create a situation in which heat illnesses are possible.

Serious signs of heat stress include unconsciousness, rapid heart-beat, throbbing headache, dry skin, chest pain, mental confusion, irritability, vomiting, diarrhea, muscle cramps, staggering and difficulty breathing. People experiencing these symptoms should seek immediate medical attention. While waiting for help, move the person to a cool area, remove excess clothing, spray with water, and fan the person. In an emergency, dial 911.
