2023 GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT AWARDS NIGHT CEREMONY

Chief Harkins began the ceremony by offering a moment of silence to remember the number of on-duty deaths for 2022: 246 officers. There's been 42 on-duty deaths so far in 2023. Chief asked everyone to take a moment and remember these officers' sacrifices. "I'd like to thank all who have been involved in putting this great event together to honor the great work of our officers, our partners, and the civilians who have such an impact in our community," said Chief Harkins. Chief thanked Mayor Mayer, Council President Mercado, Township Council and the Township Administration: "It truly is a team effort to do everything that we do in the Police Department. We couldn't do it without their unwavering support that they have for the Police Department and the work that they do for our community of Gloucester Township day-in and day-out. It's a privilege to be part of this team of the Gloucester Township Municipal Government. With their support we continue to improve and make great strides in our law enforcement mission of public safety." Chief recognized Deputy Chief Minosse, Capt. Barton, Capt. Stollsteimer, Capt. Gittens, Lieutenants and Sergeants, Detectives, Officers, Telecommunication, and Civilian Staff. "It's the people of the Gloucester Township Police Department who get the job done. I believe more now than ever that there's no more noble profession than being in law enforcement. There's no greater calling than for those who go out every shift, 24 hours, 7 days a week, 365 days a year, and place their lives on the line to serve others."

This week Mayor Mayer stopped by the Library in the Downtown Blackwood section of Gloucester Township and signed up for a library card!

Did you know that your Library card is your access to the abundant resources and services of the Camden County Library System? With your card, you may borrow books, audiobooks, music, Jetpack mobile hotspots, Chromebooks, and museum passes. In addition, your card will enable you to download digital media such as ebooks, access streaming platforms such as Kanopy, and search electronic databases.

Your Library also offers you:

- Librarians who are here to help you navigate the wealth of information available in today's world and guide you through the library's collections for learning and fun.
- Computers, printing, scanners, shredders, laminators, and easy-to-use wireless (Wi-Fi.)
- Public meeting rooms that may be reserved for individuals and groups as well as Virtual Meeting Rooms that can be reserved for online meetings.
- An exciting range of free events, programs, classes, book clubs, and more.
- The Museum Pass Program offers free admission (usually 2 adults and 4 children) to participating locations. These passes can be checked out for four days.
- Press Reader, which offers digital access to thousands of newspapers and magazines (including the Philadelphia Inquirer and The Athletic).
- Full digital access to the Wall Street Journal and the New York Times.
- Business Resources, including the Gale Business Plan Builder, which is a step-by-step tool for building or optimizing a plan for a start-up business or non-profit.
- The Adult Literacy program offers free tutoring in reading, math, and/ or English language acquisition.



GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP RESIDENT RELEASES A BOOK


