GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP TOWN HERO: VINCENT DIVINCENZO

Vincent Divincenzo joined the Air Force on July 25, 1973, 5 weeks after he graduated from Highland High School.

He completed Basic Training at Lackland Air Force Base outside of San Antonio, TX. After basic training, Vincent went to Aircraft Maintenance School at Sheppard Air Force Base, TX, and was an Honor Graduate. Because of this honored status, he was assigned to the Heavy Maintenance/Crash Recovery Crew.

In 1975, Vincent was sent to Taiwan to assist in retrieving an airplane that was hit by a rocket, but it had been totally destroyed.

His next assignment was in West Germany with the 601st Tactical Control Wing flying OV-10 Bronco aircraft. This was the only US Air Force in Europe. Their mission was to fly the Fulda Gap, where the flat terrain would allow a massive armor assault from the Warsaw Pact nations.

One of the pilots on this mission was Capt. Darrel Whitcomb, whose story eventually became the movie "BAT*21" and the book "The Rescue of BAT-21."

At Sembach Air Base, Germany, Vincent was the backline Flight Chief responsible for 10 OV-10s and all the new kids that had gotten assigned there. They were fresh out of Tech School, and he was only 21 at that time.

Vincent was one of four enlisted men authorized to fly in the OV-10 (Permission had to be given by the 17th Air Force and 4th Allied Tactical Air Forces). During his time with the 601st, he had spent time in Italy, Spain, and the Netherlands.

During his career in the Air Force, he also got to fly as a helicopter door gunner at the Bardenas Reales range in Spain; he performed an aerial refuel of an F-4 Phantom over St.Louis, flew actual live ordnance, and participated in FAC missions at the National Training Center at George AFB/Ft Irwin CA during AF exercises Air Warrior.

Vincent was discharged from the Air Force in 1977. In 1980, he went back in with the 111th Tactical Air Support Group (also a FAC unit assigned to the Pennsylvania Air National Guard), flying O-2 Skymasters and, later, A-37 Dragonflies. He was a full-time Air Guardsman and left the Air Guard in 1989.
