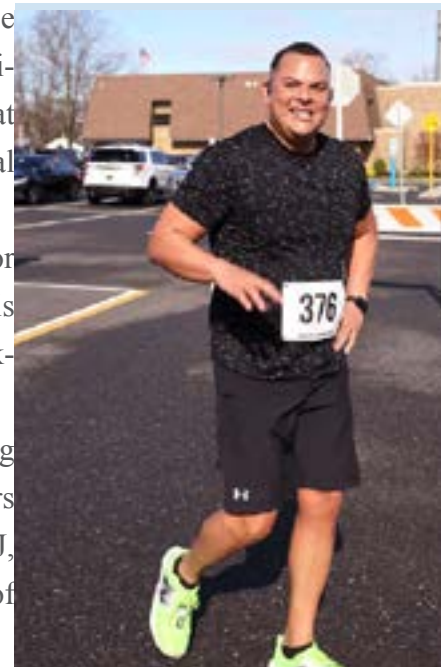


GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP DAY SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE'S 5K RUN/WALK THIS WEEKEND!
