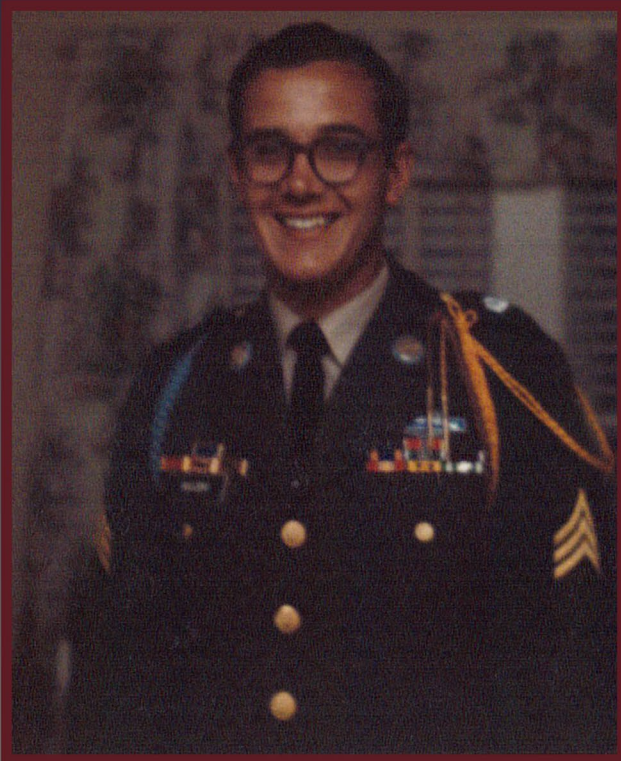
2024 Drive-In Movie Night

SGT. EDWARD A. HOLLIDAY
UNITED STATES ARMY



Edward A. Holliday was born in Camden, N.J. on June 2nd, 1948. Born to Robert D. and Annamae Holliday, he was the youngest of three children.

Raised in Runnemede, he graduated from Camden County Vocational and Technical High School in 1967. Edward volunteered for the draft and entered service in the U.S. Army on April 19, 1968. He started basic training at Fort Dix, N.J. and Advanced Individual Training at Fort Polk, LA. A month after graduating he was off to Viet Nam in the Infantry. Edward earned E-5 Sergeant, Purple Heart, Combat Infantryman Badge, Bronze Star, Air Medal and Army Commendation Medal with 1 Oak Leaf Cluster. Edward spent the last part of their military hitch at Fort Hood, T.X. as a Track Commander on an Armored Personnel Carrier.

“On January 17,1970, I married my beautiful wife, the former Margaret E. Braddock of Clementon, N.J. and moved into our present residence in Blackwood, NJ in 1971.”

Edward worked at the Philadelphia Naval Shipyard for 18 years till they closed. He then worked at McGuire Air Force Base for 2 years and, after that, at U.S. Mint, Philadelphia, for 13 years.

Edward is now retired; Gloucester Township thanks him for his lifetime dedication to our country!

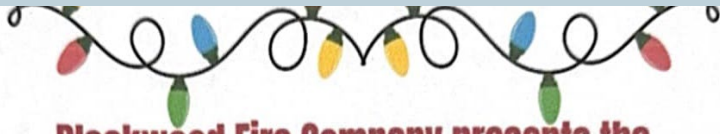
